Q: *What would life be like if the Fall had not occurred*?

A: It is interesting to imagine how the world would be different if major events had turned out differently or if influential people had reached a decision opposite from what they did. A whole genre of writing today—called alternative or virtual or counterfactual history—is devoted to spinning out the consequences of different historical outcomes. What if the South had won the Civil War? What if the American Revolution had failed? What if Adam and Eve had not sinned against God?

Those scenarios can be fascinating, but they all share a fatal flaw. They can never be more than speculation. No one scenario can possibly be right, because none of them actually happened. The only consequences we can know for sure are the ones that really occurred.

That is true of the Fall, as well. The entire opening prologue to Genesis, chapters 2-11, was written to describe the real and tragic consequences of sin. It sets the stage for God's plan to redeem sinners and restore creation, which began with Abraham and culminated in Jesus. That plan is the only outcome we can truly know, for it is the one—the only one—that God has chosen to work out in and through the Church.

giving joyfully, growing ministry

Early in November, members of Faith will receive a statement of their giving to the church through October of this year. Please examine it carefully to see if it reflects the commitment you intended to make—or are able to make—to the mission and ministry of Faith this year.

Faith has seen a worrisome trend growing. Even though our church's financial health has improved dramatically in the last five years, offerings to the church have remained flat or declined. *Giving so far in 2014 is at the lowest level since 2010!* The General Fund currently has a *\$27,000 deficit*, even though spending year-to-date is *\$34,000 below budget!* Faith's leaders have managed to do more with less, but that is not a sustainable pattern, much less allowing for expansion of ministry.

Remember that Christian giving is first and foremost a response of *gratitude* to what God first gives us—ourselves, our time and our possessions. How has God blessed you to support the vital ministry God is doing in and through Faith Lutheran Church?



Have you received and read all the information about the Imagine Capital Campaign and the difference it can make in paying for the new building addition? We hope so. If not, it is still not too late!

The space for ministry this building provides is heavily used in many creative ways. A generous, faithful response to the Imagine Capital Campaign could dramatically reduce the time and cost of paying for it.

All members of Faith will soon receive an Imagine pledge card. Please consider in prayer how God is calling you and has blessed you to support this effort. Then return your card on (or before) *Commitment Sunday*, November 16, 2014. The following week, November 23, we will thank God together on *Celebration Sunday* for the commitment the Holy Spirit will inspire in us who together are Faith Lutheran Church.

The Befriender Ministry has been a part of Faith Lutheran Church for over fifteen years. Over the years, twenty-five members have taken the twenty hours of training and became "Befrienders". Those twenty-five have "officially" Befriended seventy-nine people through regular visits, phone calls, emails and card sending in addition to the informal Befriending to many more people.

Pastor Paulus and the rest of the pastoral staff have seen and heard from others how important this ministry has been and is to the people of Faith Lutheran Church. Even though we have several pastors on staff visiting regularly, it is comforting to know that there are others in the congregation who are reaching out; not only the Befrienders but many others as well. Because of this and the need to reach more people, Pastor Paulus and I, together with the Senior's Task Force, have been making plans to join together to support, expand, invite and train others to come alongside the Befrienders. The training will not be as extensive or academic. Instead we would supply information and support to enable visitors to provide meaningful contact with those who would benefit from visits.

The name will change slightly to the "Befriender Visitation Ministry" and we will continue to use the logo above as a reminder of our Lord washing the disciples' feet, a clear act of serving.

Sutter's Cross by W. Dale Cramer was October's selection by the Book Club. Sutter's Cross is a small resort town in the southern Appalachians where the people live comfortable, predictable lives – until a homeless drifter who calls himself "Harley" shows up at the church picnic. His presence is unwelcome by many, but he is befriended by Jake (and Lori) Mahaffey, a local contractor, and by elderly Agnes Dewberry who takes him into her home. Meanwhile, Web Holcombe, a wealthy and ruthless businessman uses his money, power and influence to get whatever he wants by whatever means are needed. How Holcombe's selfish and sometimes illegal actions affect the lives of Harley, the Mahaffeys, Agnes and his own young son, Eddy, keep the story suspenseful, moving from one crisis to another. The many sub-plots and colorful characters keep the reader's interest to the exciting end.

Can God use a homeless stranger and outcast to change people's thinking and turn a town upside down? Read it and find out!

Some of FLC's support for ILT may be directed to defray some of his tuition expenses. Again this congregation's generosity is making a big difference.

1st Year of Augustana District Ethiopian Partnership Makes Huge Strides


- 1. 39 evangelists are receiving support.
- 2. Construction of multiple worship centers are underway.
- 3. Transportation given to make witness more effective, 3 motorcycles to evangelist coordinators, and multiple bicycles to evangelists.
- 4. Funds given to assess opening new Mission Centers in distant parts of the country.

By year's end well over \$75,000 will have been given. (Faith Lutheran Church has made a \$5,000 - 2014 commitment to this partnership.)

GETTING TO KNOW YOUR STAFF

Paulus Pilgrim grew up in Minnesota. His dad was a pastor so they moved about from parish to parish. The last place he lived with his family (one sister and three brothers) was in Hector, MN where he graduated from Hector High School. He then went to Wartburg College in Waverly, Iowa and later to Wartburg Seminary, Dubuque, Iowa. He was ordained in May of 1960 and spent nine years at two parishes in Nebraska; then moved back to Minnesota. They were in Springfield (St. Paul's) for ten years, seven years in Montevideo (Trinity), and thirteen years at Madison (MN) Lutheran Home and Hospital where he was a Chaplain. Gladys and Paulus met at Wartburg College. Her original home was Auburn, Nebraska. They moved to Hutchinson fifteen years ago, and he serves as the Visitation Pastor at Faith.

Pastor Paulus and Gladys have three children and four grandchildren. Son, Randy is an ER physician, and lives in Lafayette, Louisiana. Tim is a construction project manager and lives in Shoreview, MN. Their daughter, Cheril, is a national parks system property administrator in Glacier Park, Montana.

In his position at Faith, Paulus visits Senior members and cares for them in a variety of ways in the name of Jesus. It is a shared ministry, with all the members of the Pastoral Care team. He conducts funerals when asked to, preaches on Bless the Years Sunday, leads Seniors Potluck meetings, and "just enjoys parish ministry and membership".

His favorite part of this call is visiting people of all descriptions. He learns much from all of them, especially when they speak of, or live out, their faith, how God enables them to live joyful and victorious lives, through trials of all descriptions.

"The hardest part of this job is how emotionally heavy it gets when walking with people through unbelievable pain and grief. Conducting funerals for people you've known well and become endeared to can be exasperating," shares Paulus, "but the Gospel of God's love and promises, made good in and through Jesus Christ, is enough to '...rejoice in all circumstances..' as St. Paul writes."

He says he "feels blessed and grateful for having been called by God and Faith Lutheran to serve here."

We are truly blessed to have him and Gladys providing care and sharing in the ministry at Faith!
