director, Mike Lauer. We also want him to introduce himself to us as another of our newest staff persons. Come, and bring a friend or friends. We have plenty of room, plenty of food, and lots of love to share. Jesus does that to us.



Q: Was God ever a baby? Does God have a Dad?

A: These questions from a confirmation group are perfect for Advent and Christmas. They go straight to the mystery and joy of this season.

The answer to both questions is No. The witness of the Bible is that God has no beginning or ending. Anselm of Canterbury famously defined God as "that, than which nothing greater can be conceived." In other words, if you can imagine anything before God, after God or greater than God, you haven't gotten to God yet. God is eternal—as hard as that is for us to grasp.

The answer to these questions, though, is also Yes. The great wonder of the Incarnation is that God's Son "emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness." (Philippians 2:7) God chose to *become* a human baby, to live among us and to die on the cross to rescue us from sin and death. And that child, Jesus of Nazareth, revealed God as his Heavenly Father, and also ours.

Just imagine! The eternal, all-powerful God who made heaven and earth also knows what it is to be a mortal human being, to suffer and to die. God endured all of that in Christ, and then raised him from the dead, because he knows you and me, and loves us with perfect, steadfast love. That is what makes the Gospel such immeasurably good news.

THANK YOU - Operation Christmas Child

Thank you to all who participated in the Christmas box program this year. We hope you saw the stacks of boxes in the gathering space. We shipped 111 boxes. If you completed a box or two, thank you!! If you brought boxes, or items to complete boxes, thank you!! If you gave money for shipping them to their destinations, thank you! However you helped, thank you!! Please add your prayers that God will use them for His purposes---to bring Jesus into people's lives.

Franklin Graham, who has personally handed thousands of boxes to children writes, "Whenever I give Operation Christmas Child boxes to children



overseas, I am amazed at the way God uses these simple gifts to bring such great joy to every boy and girl. But the most important thing of all is that every child has the opportunity to hear the Gospel of Jesus Christ." "What happens to the boxes?" I hear. First, Dean Dietel, along with boxes from Christ the King, transports them to a warehouse in the Twin Cities, where they are inspected and repacked if necessary. From there they are shipped to countries far and wide, like the Philippians, Nigeria, Iraq, Liberia, the Congo and more, especially to places that are devastated by poverty or destruction by storms or disease. Don't you wish you could see the smiling faces and energized bodies as the boxes are distributed and opened? Children receive things they never dreamed of. They are told that the boxes come from God through people whose lives have been melted by His love in Jesus, and can't keep that love to themselves. The hope and prayer is that they come to feel this Jesus must really be something, and that they need to check that out in provided Bible schools and through Christian people. God's saving love is for them too. Simple boxes, and toys, shirts and toothbrushes are instruments to spark their interest and lead them on to the greatest love they will ever know, in Jesus.

Not only recipients' lives are changed. In Phoenix, Arizona, there is a "Changing Lives Center," for young teens and women who have been in drugs and gang life, unimaginable brokenness. In the Center they are learning how Jesus transforms their lives from brokenness to knowing what it's like to give. They are hoping to pack 200 boxes from their meager resources.
