It's Epiphany!!

Yeah, I know, big deal right?

What's up with Epiphany? It's like the

step-child of church seasons. Let's just skip to Lent, already! And what little we actually remember when it comes to Epiphany- the three kings- we get wrong anyway! Try this little quiz:

- 1. How many kings came to see Jesus?
- 2. How many wise men, or magi, came to see Jesus?
- 3. The wise men saw Jesus in:
 - A manger A house
 - A stable
 - A good mood



Well, if you gave any number for the first question, you were wrong. The wise men were not kings! That's a tradition that arose years after. More than likely, they were scientists, astronomers, who studied stars. As to the second question, if you gave the traditional answer, three, you also may be wrong. The truth is, the Bible never says! We get the number three from the number of gifts mentioned, but there may have been many more magi than three. Finally, despite the inclusion of three wise men in many of our Christmas nativity scenes, it is not very likely that the wise men showed up the night Jesus was born. In fact, Jesus may have been almost two years old! Matthew 2:11 describes the wise men finding Jesus in a house, so he was well beyond the feed trough days.

How'd you do? Have I shattered your already-low impression of Epiphany even further? Well let me rescue it!

Epiphany is a time to commemorate the manifestation of Jesus to the world. During Epiphany, we remember how Jesus was introduced to the world beyond that silent night. It starts with the star introducing the new king to the searching wise men. It continues with other revelations of Jesus, including his baptism, his first miracles, his first teachings, and his Transfiguration. These stories are filled with wonder and awe, and show us who Jesus is.

But even more than commemorating how Jesus was made manifest back in the first century, we believe Jesus continues to manifest himself to us today.

He is made manifest in the simple yet powerful words of forgiveness. He is made manifest in the proclamation of the Gospel. He shows up in the least of these. He comes to us in the bread and the wine. He's here. For you.

Come, let us adore him. Start your year off with an Epiphany.

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Who Would Have Thought?

A Story of Amazing Witness

Who would have thought that a covenant partnership begun last January could have come this far? Eleven representatives of the little Augustana District went to Hawassa, Ethiopia, to form a partnership with the Tabor Congregation of the Ethiopia Evangelical Church Mekane Yesus. Moved by the powerful experience of witnessing the spiritual depth and commitment of this one congregation's Spirit-moved witness to Jesus Christ, these representatives returned and have been telling the story.

Now twelve months later nearly \$100,000 dollars has been given by congregations and individuals of the Augustana District to extend these people's brave, sacrificial witness. Thirty-nine evangelists are supported, numerous worship centers are being built, motorcycles and bicycles are making the work of evangelists easier, and farmers are being assisted in being better providers for their families.

It is a wonderful story. Faith Lutheran Church will have given \$5,000 to this effort in 2014. It also is providing leadership of this partnership by funding Pastor Paul's position, a significant portion of which helps coordinate this District initiative.

Q: Since God forgives our sins for Jesus' sake, does it really matter what we do or how we live?

A: This question was already being asked in the New Testament church. In Romans 6:1, Paul asks, "What then are we to say? Should we continue in sin in order that grace may abound?" There is a certain logic there: we like to sin, God likes to forgive, so we can keep each other very happy, right?!

But Paul answers his own question, "By no means!" In Greek, it is the equivalent of saying, "Don't even think about it!" But the reason he is so appalled at the idea is a matter not of *obedience*, but of *identity*. Paul goes on, "How can we who died to sin go on living in it? Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized in Christ Jesus were baptized into his death ...so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life?"

Being baptized into Christ, the question is no longer "What do I have to do?" nor "What can I get away with?" The question instead is, "Now that I am a new creature in Christ, what do I want to do?" What thoughts and actions reflect the love of Christ and what would betray His will for me and for the world, instead?

Looking back on their childhood, many adults will admit that they feared disappointing their parents more than they feared their anger or punishment. That is the same motivation for striving to obey God's will. His grace and love for us do not depend on what we do—they are as freely given as parents' love for their children. But, being so graciously loved, why would we think, speak or act in ways that we know would disappoint Christ or defy his will? By God's free choosing, we *are* His children, so our call—in fact, our very nature—is to live out that identity in joyful obedience to our heavenly Father and Christ, our brother.
