In his Small Catechism, Martin Luther explains that, for us, this means setting aside a day to rest in God's Word, to "hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it." Resting in the Lord involves resting in his Word. And when we do that an amazing thing happens; we find recreation! I'm not talking about softball games or croquet matches, I'm talking about re-creation! We arise anew, strengthened by God's word to live as his children.



So what does this mean for your summer? Let me suggest some ideas to help you find rest and recreation in the Lord this summer:

Worship! Whether in the Sanctuary, at Library Square, or at a church near the cabin or along the route of your vacation; go to church!

Read the Bible! It goes good with a lawn chair or on the beach.

Start a devotional plan using the YouVersion Bible App on your smart phone. If you don't know how I'd be happy to show you.

- The youth mission trip to Cortez, Colorado is just around the corner and the final details are being planned at a furious pace.

Much more could be added to the list, but what ties these ministries of Faith together is that they are all made possible by church members faithfully giving of their time, ability and money. All the resources Faith has are those freely given and without that support, they could not happen.

Giving = Mission is not just a slogan. It is the reality of the Church. Every ministry depends on the gifts of the faithful. How has God blessed you to be a blessing to the many ministries of Faith?

Spotlight on Aging

Note: "Spotlight on Aging" usually appears in the May issue of Faith Matters. However due to illness the selected couple for this year was unable to be interviewed, and postponement became necessary. We are delighted to highlight the Petersons, Earl and Sylvia this month.



Earl Peterson takes pleasure in being the oldest living continuous member of Faith Lutheran. He has been a member ever since he was born, even though he briefly lived away from Hutchinson a couple of times as he began his career as a barber.

Earl was born in his parents' home on March 5th, 1929. His father was a long time barber in Hutchinson. He knows he was baptized shortly after he was born, but couldn't recall the pastor's name. His certificate shows it was the "pastor with the funny, round collar"---Pastor J. TH. Lund.

Childhood memories include learning to swim by age 4, at the old mill pond on the

Crow River. Two memories that stand out are when at age 4 he went on a bike ride with a black friend who was about 12 years old. Apparently the ride went on for quite a while, having lots of fun.. However, his dad thought he was lost since he hadn't been told of the ride before they left. So dad organized a search party... Another incident involved his cousin, who was the proud owner of a red car a child could drive. Unfortunately his cousin died young, and every time they visited that family Earl would admire the red car. One Christmas he discovered that very car by the Christmas tree. Earl's dad had convinced his brother to sell the car to him.

While memorizing didn't come easily for Earl, he really liked confirmation instruction with Pastor Swenson. His class of 5 students met every Saturday morning for 2 years. When confirmation day came each class member was assigned a Bible verse to memorize, and tell the congregation what that verse meant for their life of faith. That same day Earl picked up his confirmation Bible, dressed in the suit his mother had made for him. Later, Earl was active in Luther League. Besides attending meetings with a focus on Christian faith he remembers going Christmas caroling, and trick or treating on Halloween for a penny at each door, to be given to the hospital.

Sylvia Peterson was born in a farm home near Mayer, MN. Her birth date is December 27, 1930. She moved with her family to Hutchinson at age 3 and has lived here ever since. Like Earl, she has memories of swimming in the mill pond. On Sundays her family would take a ride in the car, and always stop for a 5-cent ice cream cone. When she and Earl started dating they loved roller skating at the old armory. They continued skating after they were married.

Q: A member of Faith cites Matthew 24:40-41("Then two will be in the field; one will be taken and one will be left. Two women will be grinding meal together; one will be taken and will be left") and asks, "I believe this refers to the rapture. What is our position on the rapture?"

A: The rapture is a belief that, at the Last Day, Christians will suddenly be taken from this world to the next. Those "left behind" (which is where the Left Behind books and movies get their name) will suffer great tribulation before Christ finally defeats the forces of evil. Matthew 24:40-41 is one text used to support belief in the rapture, so, in that sense, it does refer to it.

The whole idea of the rapture, though, has little support, either in the Bible or Christian theology. Although it has taken root and is widely taught in America, it stands on a narrow and unusual interpretation of just a handful of Bible verses. Only a small part of the wider Christian Church upholds it as a correct Biblical interpretation.

Rather than divine rapture out of this world, Matthew almost surely used "one will be taken" to mean sudden death. He was vividly portraying that life is unpredictable and not in our control. The larger section of Matthew 24-25 is filled with warnings that Christ will return abruptly and unexpectedly. People cannot predict his appearing and quickly prepare for it, so it is vital for believers to be constantly faithful and vigilant. Even though Jesus' second coming has been long delayed, the next verse, Matthew 24:42, is still the operative message: "Keep awake therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming."

Sylvia was baptized in a Lutheran church in Mayer soon after birth. Her confirmation was at Peace Lutheran here in Hutchinson, where her family walked a block to church every Sunday morning. Sylvia remembers having to memorize the entire catechism, under Pastor Shulte. She was age 12 when confirmed. Pastor Schulte's perspective was that if they didn't know the faith by then they never would. Girls wore white dresses and boys wore suits for confirmation day. In addition to singing in the choir at Peace Lutheran she has fond memories of the congregation and building. But, I am happy at Faith Lutheran, she tells us. They were married at Peace Lutheran, but joined "Main Street" (former FLC name), because Earl was very active here. He taught Sunday School for 26 years, and both taught and served as superintendent for 3 terms.

Both Earl and Sylvia have fond memories of their church life. Earl tells how his parents and family always sat by the third window on the south side. Once, he was allowed to sit in the balcony, if they behaved. Apparently that got out of hand, and a pastor asked the "boys in the balcony to come down." Earl felt the anger of his mother at that one.

Earl and Sylvia were in grade school together, but never dated until their junior year in high school. They were married in 1950 after Earl finished barber school. Following high school Earl, unsure of what to pursue as his life's work, drove a dry-cleaning route for a while; and later worked at a gas station. His dad wanted him to attend barber school, so that he could always give haircuts as something "to fall back on to earn a living." So he did, and stayed with the occupation. He worked in a barber shop in Hector; later in Mound, Minnesota. When his dad's partner left, he came home to Hutchinson to help and never left. People throughout Hutchinson know his history of barbering with warmth and conversation. Some say he was as much counselor as barber.

Sylvia worked at Ben Franklin after they were married but quit when she was pregnant with their son, Gary. She became a stay at home mom. Later she worked at the soda fountain in a drug store. She has also been known as a good clothing store worker.

Together, Earl and Sylvia enjoyed traveling; even owning a motor home for a while. Living at Lake Jennie was a good chapter in their lives as well.

Their faith was sorely tested when their son, Gary, was diagnosed with cancer. Gary, they report, was positive, bright and solid in his faith. His cancer went into remission for three years, before they got a call one day that it had returned and the doctor's reports were not good. For a long time they felt hurt and disillusioned, even in their faith. Why did this have to happen to a couple with an only son? Today, while the pain is not gone, they try to focus on all God gave them through a beautiful son, who dearly loved his parents, and God's faithfulness to them throughout. Some of their hardest days are when others speak of their children, grand children and great grandchildren. They think of the help they could have now as they deal with aging losses. Who could blame them?

Today, Earl lives in Harmony River, and Sylvia lives in Lake Ridge Homes. While Earl loves his room and the view out the second story, he wishes he and Sylvia could live together. Sylvia certainly does too, for this is a couple deeply in love. Together they share 64 years of marriage which, along with great joys, has also been beset with heavy trials. Through it all they know that they cannot explain reasons for trials, but that God continues to come to them with promises bigger than their sorrows. They know this gracious God will never forsake them.

Brief Update on Augustana District Tabor Congregation Partnership

An outpouring of generosity is enabling the AD to send over \$21,500 to extend the evangelical witness of the Tabor Congregation in Hawassa, Ethiopia. This brings the total to \$53,100 for the year.

The biggest addition since the last report is that we now are able to add 17 more evangelists of this congregation's outreach to other areas in Ethiopia. With this the AD is now giving half of the support for 39 evangelists. Think about this. For approximately \$22,000, 39 evangelists receive half of their income for a year. It is amazing what a modest investment is doing for the Kingdom.

Pray for these witnesses working in challenging communities.

Rejoice with the Beginning of the Shaliach Bible Institute and Seminary in India.

Note the beginning students and leaders of the "Bible School" led by Pastor K.K. Alavi and supported through the New Hope Mission Society. It is expected that in the next weeks the number of students will increase to 20.
