In February, I wrote this column just days before the special meeting where Faith Lutheran voted on whether to withdraw its membership from the ELCA. I did not yet know how that vote would turn out, so I was able to reflect on what it would mean for our life and ministry whether it passed or not.

It did pass and our constitution requires that we now vote again to confirm or repeal that decision. As it happens, I am again writing a column for *Faith Matters* just days beforehand. It gives me another chance to say what we believe is most important in this time.

I noted before that the move to withdraw from the ELCA was not meant to change Faith Lutheran or its ministry, but to keep them the same, so we can pass on the faith the way it was given to us. That underlying goal points the way forward for Faith Lutheran, whether or not the second vote passes.

The church staff and Church Council have been discussing new, creative opportunities for mission and ministry, especially in light of our beautiful new building. Pastor Paul Knudson framed this challenge in terms of Acts 1:8, where Jesus told his disciples, "You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

How do those expanding geographical circles apply to Faith Lutheran and our calling here?

Jerusalem – The equivalent of Jerusalem for us is this church, our family of faith. What would Jesus challenge in our church life? Worship attendance? Serving others? Financial support? For our mission and ministry to be effective, we always have to tend to "Jerusalem" and keep the center strong.

Judea – Our Judea might be Hutchinson or extend beyond it to the region around. Here are two ways we are at work in "Judea."

At the special congregational meeting on May 23, the resolution to terminate Faith's membership in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America was affirmed by a vote of 172-7, a 96% majority.

Faith Lutheran retains membership in Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ and is a charter member of the Augustana District in LCMC. (See the report below on the Augustana District constitution convention held at Faith Lutheran on May 22.)

AUGUSTANA DISTRICT IS FORMED!

On Saturday, May 22, 150 delegates representing 35 churches met at Faith Lutheran Church, Hutchinson, to form the Augustana District of Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ (LCMC).

The Augustana District will promote classic and traditional Lutheranism throughout the upper Midwest. Constitution and Bylaws were adopted by the convention.

The convention also elected a six-member Board of Theology and Ministry and seven-member District Council. Julie Ashbaugh and Pastor Randy Freund were elected to this council. Club 218, the summer day camp designed and run by high school youth for children from low-income families, is gearing up for its third year. It has been a great gift to our community. Reaching out further, Faith just helped form the new Augustana District in LCMC, joining other churches in common mission. Where else in “Judea” is God calling us to reach out?

Samarita – In Biblical times, Jews thought Samaritans were second-class, despised people. As Christians, we strive never to think of anyone that way, but as sinners, we can do so all too easily. Who are the “Samaritans” in our community? Common Cup and the other agencies in the Hope Center are innovative means to reach people who may not be in our churches. How else can we bring the good news into those places where “church people” are not expected to show up?

The Ends of the Earth – Christians have been pursuing this goal from the time Jesus said it. Missionaries have taken the Gospel to most places on the globe, but there are still so many people to reach. Faith Lutheran pursues that goal through youth mission trips, the New Hope Mission Society’s work in India and the Eastern European Mission Network, among others. How can we, as a church, develop a driving passion for global mission, fueled by love for Christ and our neighbors?

Beyond theological and denominational struggles, these are the exciting challenges that lie before us and motivate our church’s life. Faith Lutheran is committed to being a mission outpost for Christ and his kingdom, devoting ourselves and our resources to the most compelling, meaningful, rewarding mission of all. We welcome your ideas, concerns, inspirations, hopes, gifts, time and ability, as we move together into the future, knowing that Christ Jesus already holds it in his hands.

MONTHLY MONEY MATTERS

This monthly note connects Faith’s budget to the five mission directives in our new Vision Statement. The third directive reads, “Locally, regionally and globally we invite others. ‘Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.’ (Matthew 28:19)”

In recent years, Faith Lutheran Church has developed a strong mission identity. The best known of our mission endeavors is the New Hope Mission Society, supporting the evangelistic work of K.K. Alavi in India. But our mission extends much further than that. Did you know that the 2010 Mission Budget has 17 separate line items, totaling \$63,150.00? That money is distributed locally, regionally and globally to help invite people to believe in Jesus Christ.

Responding to the Great Commission involves each one of us. Recently, those who attended the Sunday evening Greenhouse worship service were given small invitation cards to hand to others as a way to invite them to worship. It was a simple, low-stress way to support this mission directive. The statistics on how often Lutherans witness to others is not encouraging—the average is around once every 20 years! Have you invited someone to meet Jesus lately?

Faith Lutheran also reaches out by broadcasting our radio and television services, and posting audio recordings of sermons on our web site. The radio service is also simulcast on the internet. We know people in various places who listen to our services regularly and express thanks for them.

The need to invite others goes on and on, and your faithful support of this ministry help makes it possible! *Thank you!*

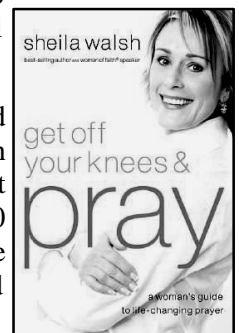

McLeod County Back to School Drive 2010

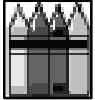


For many parents and children, the thought of going back to school in the fall is not a pleasant one. Many dread the return because of the added pressure of not having the right clothes to wear, not having a nifty new hair cut, and not having all the required school supplies that are on the list. Common Cup Ministry, and the Salvation Army would like to make going back to school easier.

The goal for the Back to School Drive is to assure that all children in need, living in McLeod County, will return to school this fall with the basic supplies needed for the school year.

How You Can Help

Salvation Army has purchased 400 backpacks. Our goal is to gather enough supplies to match or exceed the number of donated backpacks so each child can fill their backpack with the basic supplies needed. Below is a list of the basic school supplies needed. Purchase any of these supplies and drop them off in the church office or at Common Cup Ministry. Monetary donations are also accepted and will be used to purchase additional supplies. Every little bit helps!



Basic School Supplies Needed: #2 pencils, erasers, 4 oz bottles of glue, glue sticks, pencil boxes & bags, plastic pocket folders, spiral notebooks, scissors (Fiskar), rulers, boxes of color markers, loose leaf paper, boxes of color pencils, highlighting markers, protractors, compasses, calculators, 3-ring binders, black fine line Sharpie markers, pencil sharpeners with covers, pens (black, red, blue), Prang water colors, 4-pack of dry erase markers, dictionaries, thesaurus' and backpacks.

Parents must request supplies for their children by using the official request form. Forms are available in the church office and the Common Cup office. Since only 400 children will be able to receive supplies, parents need to get their requests in as soon as possible.

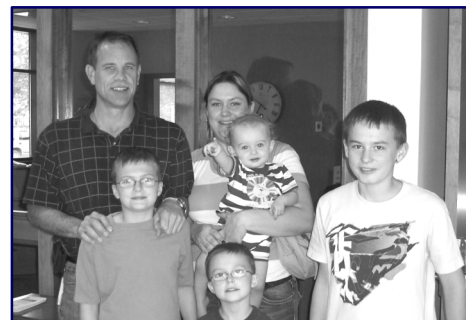

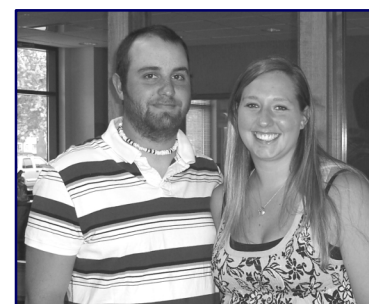
