GROWING DIVINE CHAOS

The title is meant to get your attention so that you will want to read on. The title is related to the many challenges before us - all of which are positive and exciting to me! But before I get to that, let me be clear about what I *don't* mean.

I don't imagine that many of us think of chaos as a good thing. Webster's Dictionary surely doesn't describe it that way ("utter confusion"). And even if we turn to the Bible, the message of the whole first chapter of Genesis is about God bringing *order out of chaos*. So *if* a title like "Growing Divine Chaos" means that is the state of the congregation, this would not be a good thing. That is not what I mean to convey.

"Growing Divine Chaos" could also convey another sense. With the emphasis on growing, one could conclude that we are somehow nurturing and cultivating chaos in the same way one helps a plant grow. But again, why would anyone intentionally grow confusion? And God does not need our assistance in growing anything! I don't mean to convey this, either.

There is another kind of "chaos" that *is* a part of a *(Continued on page 2)*

Did you know that, because of the prayer support and increased giving from 40 Weeks of Faithfulness combined with spending reductions:

*Faith Lutheran has made it through nearly half this year without any option to extend the line of credit? By this time last year, we had borrowed \$8,000 and in 2007, we had borrowed \$39,000!

*At one point in 2009, offerings to Faith Lutheran had fallen \$30,000 behind 2008, but they have now drawn even to last year, in spite of the economic downturn?

*Offerings for the *first two weeks* of June 2009 were equal to the *entire month* of June 2008?

*Faith has maintained a reduced schedule of mission giving through April, 2009 and hopes to fund all of its mission commitments by the end of the year?

Through the abundant blessing of God and the faithful commitment of many members of Faith, our financial situation is beginning to turn around. However, we still have a long way to go. Even a small increase in weekly giving from more of our members could assure not only that Faith would end 2009 in the black, but it could also mean reducing the \$147,000 we still carry on our line of credit.

Can you imagine what a new beginning it would be for Faith Lutheran Church to begin 2010 without any operating debt? It's a goal within our reach as we continue to trust in God who provides all we need for life and salvation.



Biblical theme and gets closer to what I am talking about. The powerful and chaotic story of Pentecost in Acts 2 caught everyone by surprise. As the early church grew and formed, there was much confusion about what it all meant; about what one believes; about Gentiles; about the people of Israel; about what food is clean and unclean: about who is saved. etc. It was a defining moment. And this kind of chaos can't be stopped. When the Holy Spirit came upon the people of God in a powerful way, there was no stopping the change and chaos and confusion that ultimately ignited a passion for the Gospel of our Lord Jesus in a way like none other.

It is this kind of "chaos" that gets us closer to what Faith Lutheran is experiencing. We are experiencing a defining moment as a congregation. A better title for this article may be "Growing *IN* Divine Chaos" or "Growing *WITH* Divine Chaos."

I write this article on the day after our June council meeting. The agenda items I reference below will give you a sense of what I mean. We have so many challenging and exciting ministry opportunities before us. These are not things we *grew* (went looking for) and no one seeks *chaos* (especially according to Webster's – "utter confusion"). But if this is a *Divine* chaos (something GOD is bringing), we can only try to meet it all with boldness, gratitude, confidence and peace. Here's a sampling of the things before us:

- * Continuing the "40 Weeks of *Faithfulness*" renewal effort through 2009.
- * Long Range Planning proposals that include outreach plans for our new building, our relationship to the ELCA, and our use of technology to spread the Gospel.
- * A formal relationship with the *Institute* of *Lutheran Theology (ILT)* that will allow us to have regular and close access to the teaching and preaching of Dr. Jim Nestingen, one of the greatest Lutheran teachers of our time.
- * Restructuring and Governance proposals designed to increase lay leadership opportunities.
- * A new worship schedule (including a switch to an 8:00 a.m. service) and new

educational opportunities.

* An upcoming special congregational meeting to discuss and explain some of this exciting "divine chaos."

And to top it all off, all of this is happening while we watch our new building addition go up!

"Divine Chaos" – It's growing before our eyes! Messy? Yes! Challenging? For sure! But what an exciting time to be a part of Faith Lutheran Church!


