## Pastor's Page

### Setting the Stage

On Sunday, November 29, the church calendar turns over a new year and begins again with the First Sunday in Advent. Advent is a four-week season meant to prepare our hearts and minds to celebrate the Incarnation, God's Son taking on human flesh in the birth of Jesus at Christmas. Advent looks backward and forward—backward to the prophets of Israel who foretold the coming of the Savior and forward to Christ's reappearing in glory at the Last Day.

There is, however, another more direct "getting ready" story for Christmas that for some reason gets very little attention. The first chapter of Luke is a long account that lays the groundwork for the beloved Christmas Gospel in chapter 2. The lectionary usually appoints just one section of Luke 1 to be read during Advent, which leaves out a whole lot of what Luke wanted his readers to know.

This year, we are going to honor Luke's intent by reading all of chapter 1 during Advent. Under the theme *Setting the Stage*, we have divided Luke 1 into four parts for each of the four Sundays in Advent. As we prepare for Christmas, we will hear everything Luke wanted us to hear in order to be ready to celebrate the birth of Jesus at Christmas.

While we are *Setting the Stage* for the Christmas drama on Sundays during Advent, we will also enact the drama itself on Wednesdays at 6:30 p.m.

The service on December 2 will feature a readers' theater called "Who's the New Guy?"

On December 9, we are privileged to have Pastor Jonathan Swenson present his one-man Christmas drama "Celebrate the Child." (He will present two other times that same day.)

On December 16, our youngest Sunday School children will present their Christmas program.

Advent will also feature special fellowship meals, Christmas caroling, a Faith Family Fun event and other opportunities to prepare for the great celebration of our Savior's birth at Christmas. Please note the schedule and details of all these events elsewhere in this newsletter and join in as many as you can, as we are *Setting the Stage* for Christmas here at Faith Lutheran.

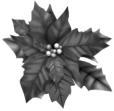

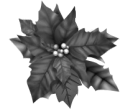

**Imagine Capital Campaign:** Earlier this year, Faith Lutheran was able to make an *extra* \$300,000 principal payment on our new building, in addition to the regular monthly payment. There was some concern that such a large extra payment could leave too small a cushion in our Imagine savings account if ongoing gifts fell short.

In the time since, the exact opposite has happened! The Imagine savings account has grown, even as the church continues to pay an extra \$5,000 in principal every month. The mortgage balance drops by more than \$10,000 per month and, if the savings account continues to grow, we may be able to make another extra principal payment this year. In fact, if the church can make a significant extra payment every year, the mortgage could be paid off by the time of Faith’s 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in 2020!

**Thank you** for your generous, faithful support of the wonderful new building. As the year ends, consider making an extra gift to the Imagine capital campaign, if you are able. Let’s keep driving toward that 2020 goal as faithful managers of this tremendous resource God has entrusted to us.

**Why Give? A Reflection on Biblical Stewardship:** Throughout this year, this little column has explored various aspects of Biblical stewardship to answer the question, “Why give?” As the theme draws to a close this month, the final answer to the question has to be, “Because you *want* to give.” Giving is a spiritual discipline and is an important way to keep our trust centered in God. It is essential for the church’s ministry to happen and a fitting response to God’s generosity. But in the end, giving only becomes natural, joyful and gratifying when we are so captivated by God’s boundless grace and so passionate about proclaiming Jesus’ saving love that we *want* to give ourselves, our time and our possessions to support the work of Christ and his kingdom.

That is what Paul means in II Corinthians 9:7, where he writes, “Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.” The Greek word translated as “cheerful” is actually *hilaron*, the root of our word hilarious. “God loves a hilarious giver.” Imagine that—finding regular, sacrificial, off-the-top giving to be hilarious, joyful, cheerful, just the best thing ever! Seem impossible? With the God we know in Jesus Christ, “all things are possible!” (Mark 10:27)

**Did you know . . .** that Diane Ferguson and Dorothy Desens have been working on several projects using donated materials from the Hutchinson Hospital, furniture stores, and parishioners, among others? The creative juices have been flowing through these ladies and together they have gotten many, many people involved in donating and making:

**Baby Blankets** – made with used pieces of blankets donated by Hutchinson Health and purchased pieces of flannel and polar fleece. These are given to Common Cup, the Food Shelf, McLeod Alliance, Global Health and various homeless shelters

**Upholstery quilts/floor coverings** – made with new fabric samples donated by furniture stores for Lutheran World Relief, the Orphan Grain Train and Global Health

**Seat protectors for wheelchairs, chairs, sofas and beds** for the DVA, VA Hospital and Memory Care Units, made from vinyl donated by Hutchinson Health and flannel donated by the FLCW

**Pillow Case Dresses** – made from donated gently used pillow cases, lace for trim, pieces of fabric for pockets and sleeves and pieces of elastic (all of which is donated)

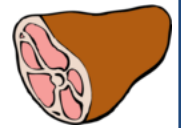

- ◆ Many more partners could be noted with the many people they serve.

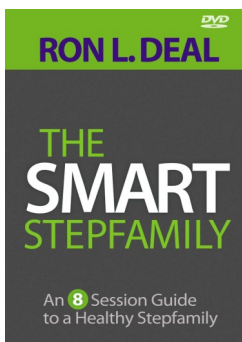

*Q: Are all the acts of terror and other tribulations happening now the apocalyptic events foretold in the Bible (e.g., Mark 13 and the book of Revelation)? Are these the last days?*

**A:** As with so many other questions about the future God has promised, the answer to these questions is Yes and No. Yes, the current state of the world clearly reflects Jesus' warning that there would be "wars and rumors of wars, ... nation will rise up against nation, ... there will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines." (Mark 13:7-8) With Christians of every time, we pray "Lord Jesus, come!" and long for the day when he will defeat all his enemies.

The problem is that any other era in history—practically any given year in history—has had all the same signs of the end, but the end has not yet come. So, the answer is also No, we cannot say that the troubles of our day mean for certain that the Last Day is at hand. Jesus also warned us of this. "But about that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father." (Matthew 24:36) God the Father simply has not revealed a timetable for creation, neither clearly nor in code, neither in the Bible nor anywhere else.

The apocalyptic events in the Bible do not apply only to a certain time, but to all times. They testify in every age that this world, although created good by God, has been broken by sin. They remind us not to seek security in anything within creation, but only in God who made and is redeeming it. They point us away from every earthly authority to Jesus Christ, the true and eternal Lord, the King of kings, to whom all authority in heaven and on earth has been given.

With our hope secured in Christ, we can face the tribulations or challenges around us, knowing that nothing can threaten his Lordship and that he has promised that nothing in all creation can separate us from his love. (Romans 8:39) To have such certainty, come what may, is the very definition of "the peace which surpasses all understanding (that) will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:7)
