"In Accordance with the Scriptures"

That familiar phrase from the Nicene Creed declares that the events of Jesus' life were prophesied in the Old Testament and that he fulfilled the promises God made to Israel. I often note in Bible studies that the earliest Christians didn't have the New Testament; they were living it and writing it. They made the case for Jesus entirely on the basis of the Old Testament, the Scriptures of Israel.

As obvious as that is historically, Christians have often forgotten or neglected it. The Old Testament has not been read or studied nearly as much as the New Testament, yet it is hard to understand the New Testament fully without knowing the Scriptures (Old Testament) on which it is based

The season of Lent starts this month and our Lenten theme will be "In Accordance with the Scriptures: Christ in the Old Testament." It will explore Old Testament texts that point clearly to Christ and show how the course of his life and what he accomplished were foreshadowed by God through Israel's experience. in February as we all continue to *Imagine* together the future God has in store for Faith Lutheran!


Faith-full Finances

Stump the pastor

Q: Who decided which 66 books would be included in the Bible? How do we know they are inspired by God and other books were not?

A: There were many Jewish and Christian writings in the ancient world that were well-known, but not included in the canon (authoritative list) of the Old or New Testaments. The Old Testament canon was finalized by Jewish rabbis around A.D. 90 (although most of the books were already widely recognized as Scriptural). The New Testament canon was finally set in the 3rd or 4th century, although most of those books had also long been recognized as Scriptural.

When we consider how the canon was formed, there are some important points to keep in mind. One is that there was no group or person who just "picked and chose" which books belonged in the Bible and which did not. In each case, it was the

result of a long process of evaluation by the people of Israel, for the Old Testament, and the Christian church, for the New Testament.

Secondly, Bruce Metzger, a great New Testament scholar, has noted a really important distinction. The books in the Bible are not considered to be inspired by God *because* they were included in the canon. They were included in the canon *because* they were recognized as being inspired by God. The quality and integrity of the writing made the difference, not some arbitrary decision.

Finally, as Christians, we believe this entire process was informed and guided by the Holy Spirit. These were not purely human decisions, but those who decided were themselves inspired, so that God could use the books that were included to do His saving work faithfully and effectively among us.

That is finally how we know the Bible is God's Word. It works in people's hearts and minds to grant faith, preserve hope and reveal the gracious reality of God's love for us and all people.
