reminder to our Christmas celebrations.

When the Wise Men appeared in Jerusalem asking where they could find the newborn King of the Jews, King Herod immediately sought the answer from the chief priests. Based on a passage in Micah 5, they said that such a child would be born in Bethlehem. Herod pretended that he wanted to worship this new king as the Wise Men did. The reality was that he was infamously paranoid about threats to his rule. He even had several of his children murdered when he thought they were plotting against him. He only wanted to know if the Wise Men found the child Jesus so he could eliminate him.

God warned the Wise Men in a dream not to return to King Herod and report on what they had found, but that frustrated Herod's plan to destroy this supposed threat to his throne. In fury, he ordered a scattershot effort to accomplish his goal by killing all the children in and around Bethlehem who were two years old or younger.

It was a cruel and senseless act in any case, but especially since Jesus had no designs on King Herod's or any other earthly throne. But it is also a powerful illustration of how Jesus, the incarnate Son of God, challenges all earthly powers and authorities—including those idols that so easily take up residence in our own lives. That is why this horrific account should not be forgotten or ignored, but read as a cautionary tale and a call to repent.

#### **Important Dates**



In December, Faith's mortgage lender, Thrivent Financial, agreed to reduce by 50% the amount of reserve funds that must be held on deposit at Thrivent. That amount, along with the gifts given toward the \$20,000 matching challenge at the end of 2016, and our annual opportunity to re-amortize the loan will all help to accelerate the payoff of the mortgage. As we begin 2017, the principal amount has fallen below \$2 million and the life of the loan has been shortened by nearly ten years! Thank you to all the members and friends of Faith who have given so generously to provide this marvelous space for ministry.

## **Faith-full Finances**

Since the deadline for this issue of *Faith Matters* is mid-December, we do not know as of this writing how Faith Lutheran's finances turned out at the end of 2016. But we do know and trust that the Lord

will provide the resources necessary to carry out the ministry and mission He has entrusted to us here. Faith's leaders thank all of you who have given faithfully this year as God has blessed you and ask that you would continue to invest in Faith Lutheran in 2017. As you return to God a portion of what He has first given you, it enables the church and its staff to proclaim the good news of Christ to all whom we encounter, here and around the world.

#### **Mission Causes Receive Marvelous Support**

A big thank you goes out to everyone from Faith who has given so generously in the past weeks for multiple mission causes. Final totals may change, but this is what can be reported so far.

November Hunger Response: Approximately \$9,000 was given. This is almost double our base goal. 35% will go to help Hurricane Matthew victims through Samaritan's Purse. 35% will go to Common Cup to meet local needs, especially to fund their weekend back-





pack program to provide students in need with food. The remaining 30% will be split between Friends of Madagascar Mission and the Augustana District partnership with the Tabor Congregation in Ethiopia. Donations

given to these causes will fund emergency food assistance to people in dire need.

Heavy Duty Van for Tabor Outreach Support and Training. Over \$8,000 has been given or committed towards the goal of \$9,500. Faith members gave over \$3,500 towards this need. This also was a wonderful and generous response.



Fill the Boat and Common Cup Concert: Again Faith members stepped with amazing generosity. The boat was filled with 1,061 pounds of food and the annual concert brought in over \$9,000. Thank you for meeting local needs so abundantly.






