- Q: If God made the laws that govern the universe, how can He do miracles that break those laws?
- A: This question from a middle school student is very in sightful. It is a question that has troubled believers and skeptics alike for centuries. Even some Biblical


scholars today deny that miracles could happen—in ancient times or today—because they violate the laws of nature.

Yet, we know that miraculous events do occur. People are suddenly and unexpectedly healed. Others survive accidents or disasters for no obvious reason. All four Gospel accounts record Jesus doing miracles in a very similar way, which would be highly unlikely if the evangelists were just making them up.

But how is any of that possible? The simplest answer is that God is God. He made the rules; He can change the rules, much as a legislature—and only a legislature—can change laws that were previously passed. In asking what God can or cannot do, we too often assume that He is limited in the same ways we are. But if our conception of God is limited in any way, we have too small a vision of God. St. Anselm defined God as "that than which nothing greater can be thought." That means that God is greater than the laws He set up to govern Creation.

A little variation on an intriguing illustration that C.S. Lewis offered in his great book, *Mere Christianity*, might apply here. Imagine God as an author and creation as His "book." After completing the work, the story is set. It unfolds in a certain way. Yet, like any author, God might go back and alter a scene to improve it or change a detail to solve a difficulty. No one but the author is sanctioned to do that, but no one would question the author's right to do so. Yet, for any new reader, the book still reads as if the revisions had always been there.

The analogy is not perfect, of course, but it does suggest how God can intervene in the "story" of creation, without changing how He originally designed creation to work, and why He might choose to do so. The Bible reveals that God is deeply invested in the world, especially people. He is willing—and able—to change course or do a "new thing" (Isaiah 43:19) to further His will to redeem the whole creation.



As we approach the beginning of our summer schedule, several things come to mind regarding music and worship. One is the end of my first season directing the vocal and bell choirs at Faith, which has been an extraordinarily rewarding (if new and challenging) experience. I'm already planning music for next fall, and I welcome all new and returning members with enthusiasm! If you have any interest in ringing handbells or singing (or both), please contact me and I'll make sure to keep you in the loop when the new season starts. Second, yet far more significant, is the commencement of our outdoor services at Library Square. These present an occasion for unity and outreach arguably unmatched by our normal operations throughout the rest of the year. With all our 10:10 attendees truly comprising one unified second service, this facilitates a much greater sense of community with our fellow believers. Finally, I'm told to expect people spontaneously deciding to join us as they drive or walk past on Main Street. This is an incredible opportunity to be witnesses for Christ in our city, so let's show them what His worship is all about. It's about more than a song, more than a show: it's about repentant sinners responding with grateful hearts to a Creator who would pay dearly to have us back. I pray for us all, for the courage to leave behind our comfort zones and to step into this marvelous grace with fresh eyes and a joyful heart.

#### **Christian Life Management**

At a recent staff meeting, Josiah Frusti, our Director of Children and Family ministry, showed a picture he had taken at Faith Rocks, the worship time that begins Sunday School each week. It showed an offering basket with several dollar bills, a few coins and half of a red crayon in it. One Sunday, he had talked with the children about giving, why Christians do it and why it is important. At the end, he took an offering and one young child told him, "I don't have any money, but I'll give part of my crayon."

"A little child shall lead them," just as the prophet declared! (Isaiah 11:6) This child's example illustrates the main elements of Biblical stewardship:

- \* Give of what you have, without worrying that it is not enough.
- \* Give what has real value to you, even it is hard to part with it.
- \* Keep what you need for your own use—it was perfectly appropriate that the child kept half of the crayon to keep drawing.

\* Give with a glad and generous heart, in gratitude for how richly God first blesses us!

What can you and I learn from this young Christian witness about our own approach to giving?

#### Imagine Capital Campaign

Due to extra principal payments, lowered interest rates and annual re-amortization of the loan, Faith's required monthly mortgage payment has dropped by 47%, from \$19,413 to \$10,365. However, the church has continued to pay the original amount all along. That means, at this point, that just over 75% of each month's payment, over \$14,700, goes to principal! What makes such great stewardship possible is continued generous giving from the congregation and wise management of funds on hand by church leaders. 
Praise and Prayer for First Graduates of the Shaliach's Bible College
