IV. Secretary's Report

a. In addition to the minutes; the minutes from the September 2013 Special Congregational Meeting on the Calling of Pastor Dave Wollan were handed out.

V. Treasurer's Report

- a. Amazing year end giving offering income exceeded budget this year.
- b. Lower expenses because Staff costs were lower and because of Pastor Randy's leaving.
- c. Board approved the payoff of entire operating budget loan.
- d. Church still has adequate cash balance.
- e. Paying off the operating loan frees us an additional \$2,000 a month.
- f. Action: Motion/Second/Pass To accept the Treasurer's Report.

IX. Order of Business:

a. Legacy of Faith...Moving Forward

- i. General fund monies are not used to pay for the mortgage. Legacy of Faith gifts are used for that.
- ii. Offerings have covered the mortgage payments without using reserve funds.
- iii. Estate gifts and past offerings allowed us to pay down \$220,000 extra on the mortgage principal.
- iv. In three years of our loan, we have paid off 6 years of principal.

- v. Christine Ruppert of Thrivent Financial Presented:
 - 1. Loan started out at 3.2 million, which is now paid down to 2.7 million.
 - 2. Current interest is 5.375%.
 - 3. Thrivent has agreed to eliminate the ½% premium which will result in \$270,000 savings.
 - 4. Approved to lower our Interest rate to 4.875%.
 - 5. Note: FLC will continue to keep the mortgage payment the same, paying more on principal each month.

b. Report on Vision for Ministry Budget Plus

- i. Offerings exceeded our Ministry Commitments.
- ii. \$7,000 was split between paying off on loan and leaving the other half for a surprise ministry gift.
- iii. The ministry surprise is going towards 2 speakers to come to Faith. Jefferson Bethke & Daniel Taylor.
- iv. The 3rd project that the ministry surprise may go towards is to find an office space for Rev. Steve King in Faith Lutheran. FLC is still working on this, no details yet.
- v. Because of the positive impact with this surplus, \$3,500 was added as a line item onto the budget.

c. Election of Church Council Members and Ministry Team Members

- i. Pastor Scott reviewed the new council member terms and the ministry team member terms that were adopted last year.
 - 1. Correction Kent Jacobson is finishing his second year and Jan Kreie is being re-elected to the Church in the World ministry team.
 - 2. Ian McDonald is taking the other open space on the Nominating Team.
- ii. Pastor Scott thanked all outgoing members of the Church Council and members of the ministry teams.
- iii. No nominations from the floor.
- iv. Action: Motion/Second/Pass to have the secretary cast a unanimous ballot for the new Church Council and Ministry Team Members.

d. Approve 2014 Budget

- i. Due to the elimination of our past operating debt, we are able to decrease our overall budget by \$11,589 from last year.
- ii. Mission giving is calculated to reach a tithe (10%) of offering revenue.
- iii. The decrease in the personnel budget is due to several changes in staff.
- iv. Question came up of why our budget this year is less than last year. Answered that we set our expenses for the year. Everything is a guess, not set in stone. Making the Budget balance to a zero – Expenses to meet Income.
- v. Action: Motion/Second/Pass 2014 budget.

PASTORS' REPORT

We were not sure that, a year ago, we could have *imagined* all the ways God would work in and through Faith Lutheran Church.

There's that word again. Imagine!

The Imagine theme caught on early in the year here at Faith. It was the theme of the annual council and ministry teams retreat, way back in April. The staff took some intentional time to dream and scheme around this theme over the summer. We kicked off the fall imagining together, using the theme to guide our preaching and teaching. And, of course, we finished the year imagining what we could do together in the Imagine Capital Campaign. Yet through it all, even with our big dreams and ideas, God, "by the power at work within us (was) able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we could ask or imagine," just as Ephesians 3:20 declares.

We knew our new staff would be great, but we could not imagine the influx of energy, vision, productivity and faith they would bring to our staff. Sue Graff, Kacie Fahey, and Julie Guggemos served us faithfully, and now Mike Lauer, Wendy Toops, and Wendy Mayland have filled their roles excellently, bringing their own unique gifts to each position.

We knew Faith had a good reputation in the community and was a welcoming place for visitors, but we could not imagine how many great new members we would receive this year! We received over 60 new members in 2014, and they have blessed us with the fresh perspectives and deep faith that they have shared with our congregation. This fall especially we have seen new folks walk through the doors every Sunday!

We set a goal once again (for the sixth straight year) to meet all our ministry commitments without borrowing any funds, but we could not imagine that we would end the year in an even stronger financial position than we started it. Generous year-end offerings provided the church more than the minimum cash reserve needed to even out the fluctuations in giving that occur throughout the year.

We hoped that the Imagine Capital Campaign would ignite the hearts of the people of Faith and motivate a generous response for the next capital campaign, and while the response was not more than we could imagine, it was strong enough that we will be in good condition going forward these next three years.

At the same time, God has continued to do even more than we can imagine through our many mission partners. Our relationship with the Tabor congregation in Ethiopia continues to deepen, as does our work with K.K. Alavi and his son Abdul in India. Faith continues to be deeply invested in the Augustana District of the LCMC, with Wendy Mayland and Diane Pedersen providing part-time staff support and Pastor Paul leading the district's Board of World Missions. We have enjoyed working with the new interim Augustana District service coordinator—some guy named Pastor Randy Freund.

It continues to be a joy and a privilege to serve this congregation. With an ever expanding group of invested leaders—from the ministry teams to the Church Council to other lay leaders—as well as a vibrant energy throughout the life of the church, there is lots of excitement and enthusiasm for what God is doing among us!

We want to thank all those who answer God's call and invest themselves in the mission and ministry of Faith. Together, we will continue to imagine how God is calling us to serve, and be more amazed at God's imagination and call for us!

REPORT FROM PASTOR PAUL KNUDSON

This past year has been a very satisfying and to me productive year of ministry. It has been a year especially focused for me on leadership of multiple mission endeavors. This has been coupled with ongoing pastoral leadership in the internal life of the congregation. I will lift up first mission leadership and then other expressions of service.

Missions

- 1. Leading the Augustana Board of World Missions focused this year on bringing to fruition a major partnership with the Tabor Congregation of the Ethiopia Evangelical Church Mekane Yesus. After leading a delegation of eleven from the States to Ethiopia in January, this partnership has developed dramatically. Members have and will read of its development, and I will not detail it here. I write monthly thank you letters to donors. Faith Lutheran Church, with additional gifts from members, has given nearly \$11,000 to this partnership, another example of leadership from FLC.
- 2. I continue as the treasurer of the board of New Hope Mission Society. My main role is communications with special attention to writing monthly thank you letters to all donors.
- 3. I work with our congregation's Church in the World Team as a staff advisor.
- 4. I am working with a task force to seek to expand the witness of the Augustana District and other agencies to draw the national LCMC body into more intentional partnership in world mission. This is a significant initiative just beginning to develop.
- 5. I am giving leadership to the Augustana District communications on missions on its web page.

Internal Ministry Activities

- 1. I continue on a limited basis with the pastoral care ministry, visiting and leading devotional services with other team members.
- 2. I have taught various Digging Deeper classes
- 3. I gave limited leadership in the capital campaign, with my primary role being to give focus to estate planning as a long term ingredient in providing resources for facilities and other ministries of FLC.
- 4. My extensive reading does serve in my conversations with members and others seeking or resisting belief. This "apologetic" ministry is to me significant.
- 5. I think one role for me to play is that of an encourager. We have wonderful pastors, staff, and lay leaders. Giving thanks and praise to others is one of my callings.

REPORT FROM PASTOR PAULUS PILGRIM, VISITATION PASTOR

High School

Director of Children and Family Ministry

MUSIC & WORSHIP COORDINATOR

Worship – As the Director of Music and Worship, I work with the Music and Worship Ministry team to enhance the worship experience for the congregation on Sundays, festivals, and holidays throughout the church year. Our team has created and facilitated activities such as the live nativity, the Last Supper table and Faith by the Fire. Furthermore, I pick selections for the choir and bell choir to play at the services. On occasion I will also lead worship at the various services. I have had the privilege of leading worship at Harmony River this year, which is for our members and other members of the community.

Special Music – I have organized special music opportunities for our various ensembles and many gifted musicians in the church. I have had the pleasure to accompany or simply schedule their performances. The pastoral staff has requested a few special pieces that I have performed as well. We are always blessed to have special music at our services and we are always excited for new people to try their hand at one of the services.

Ensembles – On a weekly basis, excluding the summer, I prepare, practice, arrange and facilitate performance with Ringers of Faith and Faith Singers. Each group meets once a week for an hour to rehearse and performs once a month. We've seen some of the membership change throughout the last year and we are hoping to see increased attendance for both groups this coming year. The Run-Out-of-Robes campaign will start again. Last year I began, or revamped, the youth band, which we call the FLY Band, and it was a lot of fun to work with the youth and see them turn into a band that is energized and humbled by the worship leading experience.

Compline – On the first Sunday of each month, we hold an evening worship service called Compline. My role in the service is to select and arrange the music, rehearse with the band, and lead the worship. I have also spoken at a few of the services and helped generate ideas for our elements and themes. The Compline band has been, in a sense, my laboratory for trying out new musical ideas, some to success and some to blank stares. The Compline band has been as small as three and as large as nine. Each month we're able to find a fresh look at what we hope is a consistent feel.

Youth – I help plan and lead music for both ages of Sunday School children, I lead worship at Confirmation, FLY Night, and the various retreats. Working with the youth is always a treat, because you

never know how the spirit is going to move on any given night. Working with the Sunday School children for "A Christmas to Believe In" was one of the most rewarding experiences I have had at the church. It was a pleasure to have the kids learn their lines and their songs, and see the whole thing come together in a very enjoyable production. We could not have done it without the generous support of many members of the church.

Lessons – I give lessons to church members and non-church members. I am always able and willing to give a lesson or run a rehearsal for anyone who needs to help with a song they are playing at church or in the community. I am also available for non-church related music lessons.

Other – Some of the other events I have had the pleasure to create or help with were Music and Worship Vision Potluck, The Hymn Sing, the Music and Worship Camp, Worship at Faith Life Camp, the FLY Band Retreat, Worship Leading for YouthWorks! RAMP, FLY Softball, Unity Gathering Worship, Caroling, the GDS Delivery Man, and many others. I have had no difficulty staying busy at the church this year and look forward to coming years at Faith. Each year, it is the responsibility of this committee to review all staff benefit costs for medical and dental premiums, life insurance, retirement, etc. We compare costs and set policy to stay within budget for these items. All positions are reviewed and recommendations made to council for any staff needs or changes identified. In addition, a yearly review is conducted with each staff person to reflect on past accomplishments as well as looking forward to the next year. We also work with the Finance Team to make budget recommendations for the next year's Ministry Giving Plan.

2014 was not quite as active as 2013 in that we were able to replace the empty positions we unfortunately had in 2013. Julie Guggemos resigned as Faith's Administrative Assistant. We were very fortunate to have Wendy Mayland take Julie's open position. We also welcomed Wendy Toops as Director of Children and Family Ministry. A big thank you goes out to our wonderful staff. Their dedication and compassion make our Faith family complete. To our many volunteers, Faith Lutheran could not operate without you. I know I speak for all our staff when I say your time and talents are very, very much appreciated.

CAPITAL CAMPAIGNS

Can you believe that it has already been more than four years since Faith Lutheran dedicated its new building addition? During that time, the new space has functioned so well, providing room for all the ministries of Faith as well as a number of other groups or agencies that serve people in need. As the building has been put to good use, faithful support from Faith's members has also allowed us to make great progress in paying for it.

The Legacy of Faith...Moving Forward capital campaign concluded at the end of 2014. Over its three years, the church received \$865,478! That is well more than the amount that was pledged to it (\$802,096). During the three years of LFMF, Faith was able to pay down the principal on the loan well ahead of schedule, making six years' worth of principal payments in just three years. That will save thousands of dollars of interest over the life of the mortgage.

The Imagine capital campaign ran this fall. It was done entirely in-house. Sincere thanks to Debbra Marcotte, Mark Guggemos and Jessica Wendland, who served as the Imagine Vision Team. Thanks also to Pastors Paul and Paulus, who worked together to encourage people to plan estate gifts to the church.

Despite its shoe-string budget and organization, the *Imagine* campaign has so far received \$753,055 in pledges from 194 households. That is fewer households than pledged to LFMF, so we hope that number

will continue to grow. We also know that there are households that will give without pledging, so we have reason to believe that the *Imagine* campaign will also end up receiving more in gifts than the pledged amount.

With this support from the congregation, the church should be able to make at least one major extra principal payment this year. We can also re-amortize the loan once each year. That will put more money each month to principal and less to interest. These moves will shave months, if not years, off the length of the mortgage. The principal of the loan is currently \$2.6 million (down from an original \$3.2 million!), so the end is not quite in sight, but there is definitely light at the end of the tunnel.

Thank You to all those who have faithfully supported the capital expenses of Faith Lutheran, along with its ongoing ministry expenses!

FAITH LUTHERAN CHURCH ENDOWMENT FUND

The Faith Lutheran Church Endowment Fund Committee for the year 2014 continued to follow the intended purpose of the fund to enhance the mission of Faith Lutheran Church.

The Fund disbursed generated income of \$18,162.49 in 2014 as follows:

- Global Missions K.K. Alavi's work in India, Eastern European Missions Network, Global Heath Care Ministry and Lutheran Malaria Initiative
- Regional Mission Lutheran Seminary Scholarship, Faith Lutheran Church Student Scholarship, Bible Camp Scholarships, Institute for Lutheran Theology and mission trips
- Local Missions Christian Counseling Funds/Good Samaritan Fund, Common Cup, Church College Scholarship, FaithLife Camp, Prayer Shawl Ministry and Club 218

The Fund Committee continues to be diligent in carrying out the mission of Faith Lutheran Church realizing that we have the responsibility to be good stewards with these gifts that have been entrusted to Faith Lutheran Church.

MEATBALL SUPPER

Approximately 450 people were served at the 2014 Meatball Supper with a profit of \$3,711.65, which included a \$500 contribution from Thrivent Financial. Some leftovers were donated to Common Cup, which dispersed them to people needing a meal. Ten percent of the proceeds went to missions and 30% to the Legacy of Faith Capital Campaign. <u>Club 218</u>

Club 218 completed its 8th summer serving 26 children, 5 – 9 years old, from Hutchinson and Silver Lake. (15 returning children and 11 coming for the first time) Most children were from lower income families.

There were 22 high school and 3 middle school students who committed to plan and volunteer at least eight days over the summer, with most far exceeding that number. In addition, there were nine adults who volunteered during the summer.

Club 218 met at Faith Lutheran Church Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 9:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. for eight weeks. A typical day at Club 218 consisted of music, crafts, games, reading, Bible stories and a large group activity. Breakfast and lunch were provided to staff and children through the summer feeding program offered by Hunger Free McLeod. Through generous donations both from Faith Lutheran and individuals, the program continued at no cost to the families.

FAITHLIFE CAMP

The third FaithLife Camp was held at Mount Carmel Ministries in Alexandria, Minnesota, on August 15-17, 2014. We had 43 campers (32 adults, 3 youth, and 8 children) staying in cabins and lodge rooms. The theme was "Recreate, Re-create" and faith-building sessions were led by Pastor Dave and Pastor Scott.

FaithLife Camp was a bonding time for the families, as well as a time to make connections with others in Faith's congregation. Activities in addition to the educational Faith-building sessions included campfires, free time (swimming, basketball, volleyball, tie-dye shirts, crafts, etc.), a camp-wide game, and our third well-received variety show. Meals were prepared and served by Mount Carmel. Childcare during the sessions was handled by Wendy Toops, Gladys Bonnema, and 2 volunteers from Faith's youth group. Feedback from campers was again positive, saying the camp was a good, faith-centered get-away for families and friends. Repeat campers are expected next year, and we have seen some camp friendships continue into our regular church life.

The fourth FaithLife Camp has been scheduled for August 14-16, 2015. Planning will begin soon. Prayerfully consider joining us this summer!

PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY

Our Faith Lutheran Prayer Shawl Ministry began in May, 2006. We have 15 women actively involved in our ministry.
