DEVOTIONAL

My Sacrifice or God's Promise?

"God will provide for himself the lamb for the burnt offering, my son."

-- Genesis 22:8

This September has been pretty exciting for our family. My six-year-old son went off to all day, everyday kindergarten and my three-year-old daughter started preschool two days a week. It's an exciting time! My son is so ready, and my daughter is excited that she gets to call it "my school" too. We are grateful for the privilege to see our kids off to school; an opportunity many have not experienced for a multiplicity of reasons!

As exciting as it is, my wife and I were discussing how vulnerable our son seems. "What kinds of conversations will he hear at lunch? What kind of behavior will he exhibit on the recess ground?" We have done our best to raise a courteous, respectful, fun-loving, manner-minded young man, in spite of the fact that he is—like us—a dirty, rotten sinner. He knows Jesus and how to talk to God, but we won't be there to shepherd and protect him for seven hours each day!

In Genesis 22, God commands Abraham to "Take your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love...and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains of which I will show you." This is the long-awaited offspring who would carry the covenant promises of God forward. Abraham and Sarah waited for decades, hoping against hope to welcome this child before they welcomed death. When they heard he was coming, they laughed. When he arrived, they marveled. It was God who got the last laugh. They, too, gave their son an awareness of Almighty God. They had done everything they could to raise a son to survive the secularism/paganism all around them. And now, it seemed that God would like to throw all that away.

While this demand seems outrageous to us, it wasn't a far-fetched concept. The story is offensive to our modern senses, especially because it stands alone in Genesis. Honestly though, everybody around was doing it. This was a regular practice among the Ammonites, Moabites, and Canaanites.² They offered their children to Molech through the flames of fire. What made Abraham's God any different? So, off they went; the two of them together.³

I wonder if tears streamed down Abraham's face as he strolled up the mountain? It must've been the picture of total disappointment and despair. Or, is this the posture of unwavering trust in God? What seemed like an impossible demand was an opportunity to watch God intervene for the sake of God's own reputation to preserve life and keep his promises. God halts the sacrifice, keeps Abraham from following the crowd, and keeps good on his commitment to the covenant.

The same is true for our congregants and ministries. If we think we're responsible to protect and keep them in God's promises, then we don't trust the Holy Spirit to do what we never could do in the first place. Abraham didn't impress God by doing what he was commanded. How much less will you impress God if you're the solution to every problem. You were called to preach, teach, and administer the sacraments; call on the sick, marry and bury. It doesn't work to run the church like a business; neither will church growth models, small groups, missional movements, etc. breathe new life into a pandemic-tired church. I know it is hard to believe, but the promises of God—forgiveness, life, and salvation—are surprisingly sufficient for faith and the church. The confessors are quick to remind us: God will see to it that "One holy church will persist throughout the ages."⁴

With regard to my kid, I have to remember that he already belongs to God. Sure, his peers will try and lure him down a different path. Media will offer a different message. But, my son died with the Son of God, the Lamb who was provided for the sacrifice.⁵ My son died with Christ in the waters of Holy Baptism. There's nothing left to do but for him—you and me--"to live before God in righteousness and purity forever."

For Such a time As This

The headlines are all too familiar in this time and place. There is an insurrection, this time in Ethiopia. People are fleeing their homes, farms, and fields; towns are being destroyed, women are being raped, and whole families murdered. Once again, the four horsemen of the Apocalypse are stalking the land. The ancient lament of the Psalmist goes up again from the people, "How long, O Lord, how long?" We've heard it all so many times, so many times.

This time there is a difference. The people crying out are our brothers and sisters in the faith, people we have partnered with in their ministries. The fastest growing Lutheran church in the world, the EECMY, is in the midst of the suffering in Dessie and the surrounding region of NE Ethiopia. We have visited Bishop Wagnew and his people and have seen the churches and the seminary he leads. We have prayed with his people and broken bread with them. We have been amazed at their efforts, and how they do so much with so little. Now they are the ones in dire need. Refugees and victims need our help -- many of whom are people of faith in the risen Lord Jesus.

It can seem like a very small drop in a very big bucket. What can a few paltry dollars from me do in a tragedy of this magnitude? But we remember the Lord's answer in Isaiah so long ago, "Is my hand too short?" When given five loaves and two fish, Jesus was asked "what is that among so many?" but he promptly fed five thousand men, and their women and children, on a hillside in Galilee. We follow Jesus. He said "Truly I say to you, as you did it to the least of these my brothers, you did it to me," (Matthew 25:40), and "For truly I say to you, whoever gives you a cup of water to drink because you belong to Christ will by no means lose his reward," (Mark 9:41). With promises such as these, it is time, as the Spirit moves us, to be counted.

Please listen to the promptings of the Spirit and give to these brothers and sisters in need.

URGENT CALL FOR AID

FROM A KEY DISTRICT MISSION PARTNER OF THE AUGUSTANA DISTRICT NORTH CENTRAL ETHIOPIAN SYNOD



There is a life and death crisis that our brothers and sisters in Christ are facing at the hands of a military force that is raping and killing

Christians of this Amharic area of Ethiopia. Pastors and their members are fleeing their villages, coming to the central city of that region (Dessie), seeking safety.

The North Central Ethiopia Synod has been a mission partner of the AD since 2018, when we began funding a vitally important training program of their pastors and evangelists. This effort has been funded primarily through one of our AD congregations, Living Word Lutheran Church in Moses Lake, WA.

Our District sent a delegation to this area in 2018 and we were very impressed with the leadership of the synod and the eagerness of their pastors to grow in faith and as leaders in their local areas. We never expected that these same leaders would be driven from their homes and with desperate needs simply for survival.

Their brothers and sisters in Dessie, also very poor, are seeking to house and care for them as best they can. The

synod simply does not have resources to help them in face of these very dark times.

Your Board of World Missions and District Council is urging congregations and its members to respond generously and quickly to this call from our partners of NCES. These leadership groups of the AD are setting a goal of \$10,000 for this effort. By the grace of God and your responses we may well exceed this number. What we give to NCES will be allocated by their leaders for direct support to their people who have been persecuted and displaced, being the light of Christ to them in this time of great darkness.

Is your congregation getting your confirmation schedule in place? Would you like to bring your students to the district confirmation retreat along with other students from the district?

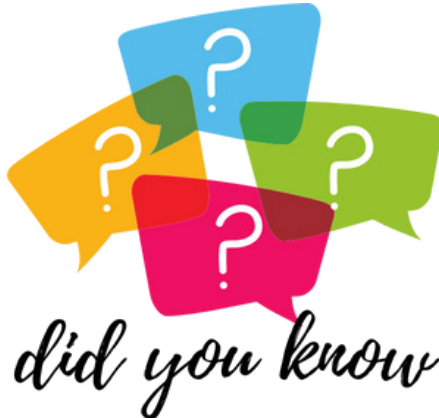

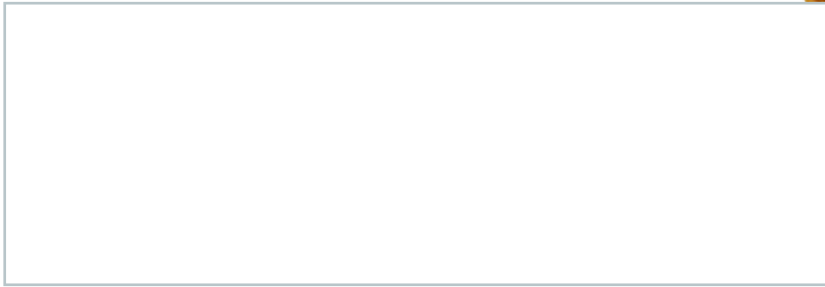
