Small Groups—whose idea was it?

For the New Testament church a couple thousand years ago, small groups were a way of life. In the Book of Acts, we find these believers engaged in life together through teaching, fellowship, communion, prayer, miracles, radical generosity, and corporate worship. They spent time meeting in homes together, eating, learning, celebrating, and proclaiming the Good News.

What are the benefits of a small group?

According to Dr. Gilbert Bilezkian, Christian lecturer and writer, "It is in small groups that people can get close enough to know each other, to care and share, to challenge and support, to confide and confess, to forgive and be forgiven, to laugh and weep together, to be accountable to each other, to watch over each other and to grow together. Personal growth does not happen in isolation. It is the result of interactive relationships. Small groups are God's gift to foster changes in character and spiritual growth."

What does a typical Faith Group do?

The Faith Group to which I belong is a vibrant part of what being a Christian is all about. Our group of 18 adults (all over the age of 60) will be meeting starting the week of September 9. We usually visit with one another until


