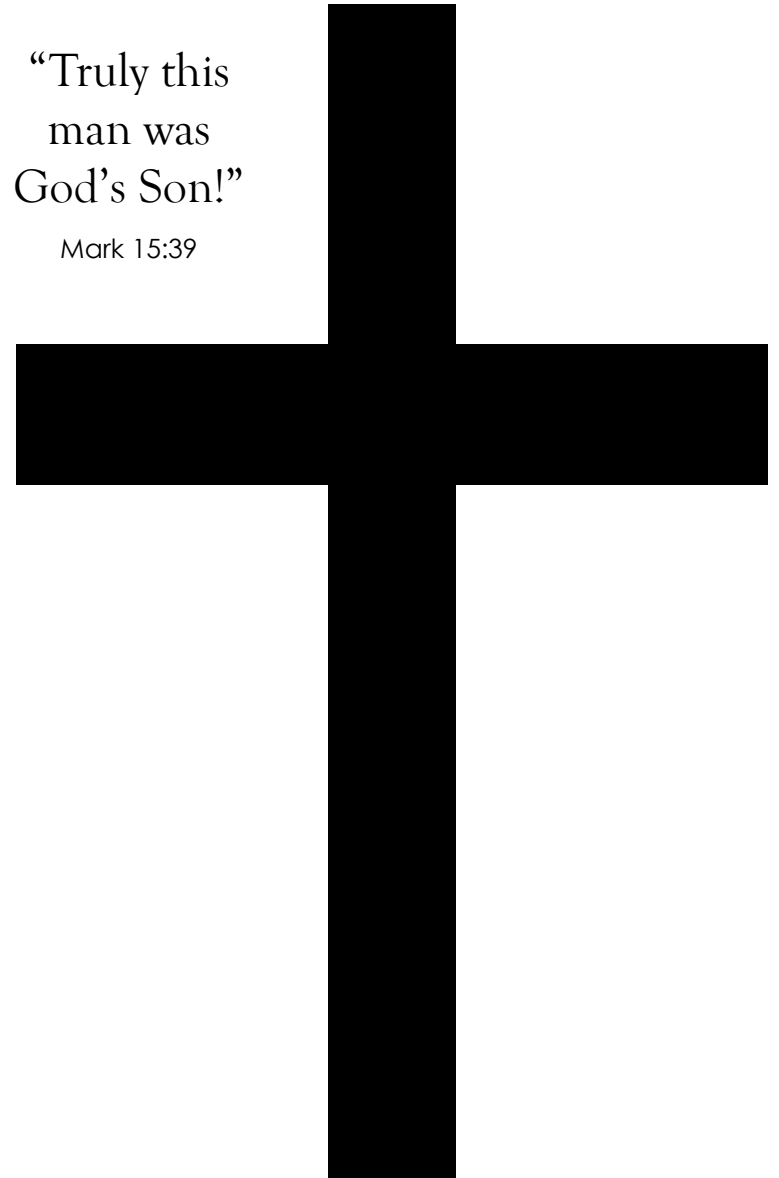

“The Seven Last Words of Christ”

Prelude

Greetings and Announcements

Opening Hymn “O Sacred Head, Now Wounded” 117 Green

✠ **The First Word** – Luke 23:32-34

Two others also, who were criminals, were led away to be put to death with him. When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. Then Jesus said, ***“Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing.”*** And they cast lots to divide his clothing.

Let us pray:

Merciful, everlasting God, who did not spare your own Son, but delivered him up for us all so that he might bear our sin upon the cross: Grant that our hearts may never be terrified or dismayed in this faith, but filled with assurance of the full forgiveness of our sin, for the sake of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

✠ **The Second Word** – Luke 23:39-43

One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying, “Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!” But the other rebuked him, saying, “Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong.” Then he said, “Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.” He replied, ***“Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise.”***

✠ **The Seventh Word** – Luke 23:44-47

It was now about noon, and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon, while the sun’s light failed; and the curtain of the temple was torn in two. Then Jesus, crying with a loud voice, said, ***“Father, into your hands I commend my spirit.”*** Having said this, he breathed his last.

Let us pray:

Merciful Lord God, your Son, our Savior, Jesus Christ was faithful unto death, even death on a cross. Grant us such faith, that we may find comfort in our sorrow and, in our dying breath, might commend our spirits into your hands, trusting in the Lamb who was slain, whose blood sets us free to be your people. In Jesus’ name. Amen.

Silent Dismissal

At the conclusion of the service, you are invited to pound the nail in your home worship kit into a cross or other piece of wood. This is a symbolic act that connects our sins to Christ’s crucifixion and death. Jesus bore our sins upon that cross. With a nail and a hammer, we acknowledge that our sins were crucified along with Christ. “For our sake God made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.” II Corinthians 5:21
