

This fall, finally, Faith Lutheran has been able to celebrate its 150th anniversary, more than a year after our anniversary events were all suddenly cut off by pandemic restrictions. A wide variety of events and projects has been tied to the anniversary celebration. For me, it has been an inspiring experience, and I am so grateful to the staff and many church members who have worked hard to make it possible.

Now, in October, we look forward to the culmination of the celebration on October 17. The whole congregation will gather for *one* worship service at 10:10 a.m. at the fairgrounds. Because none of our worship spaces in the church are big enough to hold the entire congregation, this is a rare opportunity for the whole family of Faith to be all together. I hope that none of you misses out on this special opportunity.

The service will be followed by a meal that is free, although a ticket is required. If you have not procured yours yet, call or stop by the church immediately or sooner to get one! There will be a variety of displays and activities after the meal. Plus, a number of special guests will be present to celebrate this important occasion with us. It is a "can't miss" occasion!

With all these events, projects and celebrations, plus the long, unexpected delay, I have been absorbed in the history of Faith Lutheran now for two solid years. (Of course, that is my happy place, because I am fascinated by history.) As I have re-lived the life of our church, the one overarching impression I have gained is that, while there is so much to admire in the faithfulness and dedication of the many members of Faith through the years, it is God's faithfulness that shines through most brightly.

Growing from its humble beginning of six immigrant families to a throng of some 2,300 members today, God has been faithful to Faith. In moving from Danish to English, through five church denominations and multiple building projects, God has been faithful to Faith. Enduring two world wars and several smaller ones, the Great Depression, and enormous changes in society, God has been faithful to Faith. Through years of growing wealth, luxury and worldly distractions, God has been faithful to Faith. Amidst church conflicts and divisive issues, God has been faithful to Faith.

That, above all, is the promise that Faith Lutheran's long history makes clear, and it is that promise that drives us hopefully and boldly into the next 150 years of the life of Faith Lutheran. For whatever the future may bring, the history of our church provides abundant evidence that "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." (Hebrews 13:8) Therefore, come what may, we can confidently sing that iconic Danish hymn:

All-congregation service and meal on Sunday, October 17



Stump the Pastor

Q: During Faith's anniversary, I have heard that the immigrants who started the congregation were Danish Pietists. What does that mean?

A: After Martin Luther died, two factors in particular combined to sap much of the warmth, life and energy out of Lutheran churches. One was that they were state churches, overseen by the government. Pastors and professors were employed by

the state, not the churches they served, with the result that they were often distant from and not involved with the people in their parishes. The other factor was an obsession, first with precise theological formulations and later with rational philosophy, that made worship services feel more like academic discussions than the proclamation of the Gospel.

In the mid-1700's, a movement began to try to breathe warmth and life back into the Church. It started in Germany, but soon spread to Scandinavian countries like Denmark. This movement was called Pietism and it especially appealed to common people who felt as if their churches were not ministering to them effectively and wanted to grow spiritually. In Denmark, the Pietist movement was called the Inner Mission, because it was aimed at reviving faith and devotion within the hearts of Christians, drawing them into deeper trust in God and more faithful living.

The waves of Scandinavians and Germans who immigrated to America in the 19th century consisted mostly of common, poorer people, many of whom had been blessed by the Pietistic movements in Europe and continued that emphasis here. The six Danish families who founded Faith Lutheran Church were Inner Mission pietists. Although Pietism developed its own faults, especially a highly legalistic view of what Christians are permitted to do, pietists founded many faithful congregations in this country that have since grounded generations of Christians in devout faith and life. We owe a deep debt of gratitude for the Pietist fervor that drove the founding of Faith Lutheran and has continued to shape its life ever since.

Fellowship Against Cancer

The 56er's will pack the shoe boxes on **Wednesday**, **November 10**, so all donated items must be brought to the church before that day.

If you are packing your own boxes, they must also be delivered to the church by November 10.


