

#### Greetings, Saints!

The month of November is perhaps best known as a month of thanksgiving, as it ends with that popular holiday. Beyond that it is probably also known for elections, hunting, Black Friday, and not shaving. But let's not forget another important holiday, or Holy Day! November begins with All Saints Day! November first is the Feast of All Saints, and the first Sunday in November is All Saints Sunday. So the sanctuary will be decked in white, we'll light candles and ring bells to remember the deceased and the newly baptized, and we'll sing that beautiful triumphant hymn, *For All the Saints*.

But what's it all about? Why do we have a day to remember saints? We're not Roman Catholic!

This is a good question. Of course we're not Catholic. We don't believe that a person is only a saint long after they are dead, if they lived extraordinary lives and performed miracles. As Lutherans, we confess the communion of saints, but believe that to include any baptized Christian. You and I are saints because the Holy Spirit is in us and makes us sanctified- or holy. All Saints Day is a day to remember and celebrate this reality, and pay special attention to the saints we have lost by death and the saints we have gained by baptism.

At the same time, there is nothing wrong with recognizing exceptional saints from our past and present- individuals through whom God has made a significant impact for the sake of His kingdom. As Lutherans, we can look back and be inspired by many saints that have gone before us. Here are a few:

Saint Martin Luther: The originator of our Lutheran faith was a towering intellect, a faithful defender of the faith, and a tireless worker in reforming the church. He was also a terrific sinner, and we don't overlook that, but we give thanks for the ways God worked through this sinner!

Saint Dietrich Bonhoeffer: This German pastor was not only an absolutely brilliant theologian, but also was a part of the resistance against Nazi Germany. He refused to go along with the capitulating church of that day, and instead helped to organize the Confessing Church, and underground church movement resisting the evil happening in Germany. He was martyred in a concentration camp just weeks before it was liberated.

Saint Gerhard Forde: This theologian and seminary professor has left a lasting legacy of pastors boldly proclaiming the radical word of the Lord. Forde's recapturing of Luther's radical understanding of the power of the preached word has been highly influential for Faith's pastors.

Saint Leonard and Saint Mabel: These beloved members of Faith Lutheran, through gracious generosity and fervent faith, helped to make some significant ministry initiatives possible.

# Faith Lutheran Church's *November Hunger Appeal*Blessings Flow From the Abundance of the Heart

Giving can be done without joy but under obligation. Joy comes to all of us when our Lord Jesus has filled our hearts with an abundance of sacrificial love that overflows in generosity. This happens in many ways. In November we, at Faith Lutheran Church, have chosen to

focus a measure of our heartfelt abundance in giving generously through our annual *Hunger Appeal*.

Each year we have been lifting up a minimum goal of raising \$5,000 that the hungry may be fed through trusted mission agencies we know are trustworthy and maximize dollars given so that hungry people will be fed. We focus a major portion of our giving through international partners who are committed to feeding body and soul. In these days this can, and often does, mean the difference between life and death. We give our offerings also to our trusted partner in this community, Common Cup Ministries.



Our two international mission partners are, New Hope Mission Society and Friends of Madagascar Mission. Pastor K.K. Alavi and Dr. Abdul Messiah, in their leading of our NHMS outreach in southern India, are being challenged to reach out to those in the community of faith and others in their immediate area. Friends of Madagascar Mission work in one of the most impoverished nations on earth. Providing food for those in prison and in hospitals (the responsibility of impoverished families) continues to challenge FOMM and funds given are critical to their witness through the Lutheran Church of Madagascar.

Common Cup Ministries relies on congregations like FLC to support their ministries of caring. One of their ways of meeting the pressing needs of the poor and needy in our community is through providing food to them. Our Hunger Appeal offering is a valued resource as they obtain food to meet these needs.

This year your Church in the World Team has chosen to support these mission partners as follows: International Partners: 65% of total giving, with 45% going to NHMS, and 20% to FOMM Local Partner: 35% to Common Cup Ministries

You can support the *Hunger Appeal* using envelopes marked Hunger Appeal, Mission Sunday, or Thanksgiving. You can also donate by making an extra online donation. Raising more than the minimum goal of \$5,000 will bless more people in each of these categories.




#### Faith Forward: 150 for the Next 150

#### **Stewardship Matters**

For many years, Faith Lutheran has managed to cover its annual expenses only because of massive offerings in November and December. For all those years, we have also hoped that the church could begin to balance offerings throughout the year so that the big year-end push would not be necessary and the church would not be so dependent on that late surge.



Well, hallelujah! It appears that day has finally arrived. As of this writing, the church has had to use very little of the cash cushion it carried into 2021 to meet General Fund expenses! The offering trend that was so strong during the pandemic shutdown has continued into this year. Thanks be to God and thanks to all of you who have supported Faith's ministry so steadfastly and generously!

To be honest, though, that also creates a bit of a dilemma. While the need for a big year-end push seems blessedly unlikely this year, Faith Lutheran has generally received 20-25% of its annual income in November and December each year. We will still need significant giving through the end of the year in order not to fall short of meeting our expenses this year and to avoid slipping backward. As we thank God for Faith's much-improved finances, please continue to give generously as the Lord first blesses you to do so. In gratitude to God, let's continue to demonstrate that stewardship matters!

We'll continue meeting again, in November. The date is earlier in the month due to Thanksgiving later in November. <u>Seniors' Potluck</u> will be on <u>Thursday</u>, <u>November 11</u>, beginning with potluck dinner at <u>12:00 noon</u>.

This is not a program meeting, but a MISSION MEETING. We will have our meal, a devotion, and then move on to fill Christmas Child boxes together. Officially it's called "Operation Christmas Child," or OCC for short. In the past we have packed 75 to 80 boxes. Of course we always hope we can top the last year so let's encourage each other to buy items to fill the boxes to overflowing. Lists of things to buy for this mission are posted at each church entrance. Laura Stowman has all the information displayed so you can pick up lists, or a "How To Pack a Shoebox" folder and take note of what can and can't be accepted for packing. Bring donated items by November 11, we will put them all out so that we can walk around tables and fill boxes with items for boys and girls ages 2-4, 5-9 and 10-14. We have some expert box assemblers who will have boxes for you to pick up, label them boy or girl, and the age you are packing for. You may also contribute toward the shipping charge of \$9.00 each if you desire. (Checks should be made out to *Samaritans Purse*)

All of this may sound quite materialistic, handing out "stuff" to kids. But the boxes are really meant to declare the love of God in Jesus, who motivates US, the givers. Each child who receives a box is told that it is given to them in the Name of Jesus; and they are invited to a 12-session course for their age groups about God and His love in Jesus Christ, so it is definitely a "Mission."

Some of you may prefer to roll bandages, since it is an activity that does not demand extra mobility. Materials for that will also be provided. Bandage rolling is also an important mission.

**ONE MORE THING:** Do you have a Thrivent insurance policy? Can you apply for a \$250.00 Thrivent grant to help finance this mission? If so, please do that for us. You can ask your Thrivent agent how to proceed if you need help.

# **Stump the Pastor**

Q: I know Jesus died for the sins of the world, but how do I know that I personally will be saved?

A: For each individual Christian, this is *the* vital question. Perhaps because of that, it is intriguing that even life-long Christians often struggle to be sure of their salva-

tion when death draws near. A pastor I once knew wrote a book called something like *Temptation at Sunset* to describe how Satan can step in to undermine our faith when we know that our end is at hand.

So how can one be certain that he or she personally will be saved? One of Martin Luther's most important insights was that genuine assurance cannot come from inside of us. We simply are not able to apply God's promises to ourselves in a way that is resistant to doubt and worry. Instead, true, lasting assurance must come from outside of us, through an external word that breaks into our doubts, fears and worries with the word of Another, of God Himself. Christians receive that external word in two main ways.

First, and most significant, is the covenant of Holy Baptism. There, at a time when most people baptized in Lutheran churches were far too young to know what was happening, God called us by name, drowned our sinful selves and raised us up to eternal life as new creatures in Christ. Baptism depends entirely on God's promise and reliability, not on anything within us. Whenever we struggle with doubt or anxiety, the first place to cling is to our baptism.

The other chief way Christians receive that assurance is through the absolution, the declaration that God forgives your sin for Jesus' sake. That word is declared *to* us, as well as fed to us in the Lord's Supper, so it, too, breaks in from the outside. Even though the absolution is spoken by a pastor or any other Christian, we can trust it as Christ's own word to us. In Luke 24, the risen Jesus told his disciples, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that *the forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name* to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem." When we speak the absolution, we do so at Jesus' direct command and, therefore, in his own voice.

In these two central ways, each one of us hears that God's promises are not only true in general, but that they are true *for me*. That is the only way to know beyond doubt that I personally will be saved through Christ Jesus. In listening to his word to you, and not to your own thoughts, you can be unshakably certain that God will save you for Jesus' sake.
