

One puzzling, but persistent aspect of Christian history is the reluctance or refusal of many Christians to attend worship services. Acts 2:48 says the first Christians "devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers." But already in the New Testament era, the author of Hebrews had to implore his readers, "Let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds...not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another." (Hebrews 10:24-25) Despite Jesus' promise to be present even "where two or three are gathered in my name" (Matthew 18:20) and his promise to pour out his saving grace through Word and sacrament, worship services still seem to be optional, if not something to avoid, for many people who otherwise claim to be Christian.

Through the centuries, church leaders have had limited success in persuading people to value regular church attendance, but I recently ran across an article that provides another, perhaps surprising benefit of worship services. A recent issue of *Christianity Today* featured an article by Tyler Vanderweele and Brenden Case, both from Harvard University, called, "Empty Pews Are an American Public Health Crisis."

That may seem over-the-top, but the authors say it is true. They describe the toll that decreased in-person worship attendance is taking on American public health, one which has been greatly exacerbated by the Covid-19 pandemic. Their claim is not that lower attendance is bad for the church (although it surely is), but that it is a crisis for people's mental, emotional, spiritual and physical health. They are even so bold as to write, "People find their social and personal lives improved—sometimes their lives are even physically saved—when they go to church often."

That remarkable finding is not an opinion, but is based on extensive research. "A number of large, well-designed research studies have found that religious service attendance is associated with greater longevity, less depression, less suicide, less smoking, less substance abuse, better cancer and cardiovascular-disease survival, less divorce, greater social support, greater meaning in life, greater life satisfaction, more volunteering, and greater civic engagement....

"Our research (at the Harvard University Human Flourishing Project) suggests that religious service attendance specifically, rather than private practices or self-assessed religiosity or spirituality, most powerfully predicts health...and...that declining religious service attendance accounts for about 40 percent of the rise in (national) suicide rates over the past 15 years. If the declines in attendance could have been prevented, how many lives could have been saved?"




Date Night!

O: Luke 2:52 says that "Jesus increased in wisdom and in years, and in divine and human favor." If Jesus was God incarnate, how could he grow in wisdom and if he could grow in wisdom, how can we claim that he was divine from birth?

A: This insightful question from a parishioner comes as close as any to the goal of this column, to stump the pastor! The problem, however, is not that your pastors don't know the answer, but that there is no answer.

The question is a natural one. The Bible proclaims that "the Word became flesh and lived among us" (John 1:14), but how did that actually work? As a child, how could Jesus be both fully human and fully divine? Did he skip the terrible twos? Was he some weirdly perfectly child who seemed more robotic than real? As a baby, he could hardly have known that he was the Son of God, so when did that awareness dawn on him?

The Gospels give us little help in answering those questions. Luke 2:52 concludes the only episode from Jesus' childhood recorded in any of the four Gospels and by then he was 12 years old. But it does give us some insight as to how Jesus navigated his childhood. For example, when Mary and Joseph found him in the temple, he asked a pretty clueless question. "Why were you searching for me?" That clearly shows Jesus' human nature. Like any 12-year old, he didn't get why his parents were so worked up.

Yet it was not a disobedient or selfish question. In the next breath, he said, "Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" No one around him had a clue what he meant, which reveals Jesus' divine nature and that he was becoming aware of his unique identity. That was why he stayed behind in the temple in the first place, to learn everything he could about his heavenly Father.

It is safe to assume that Jesus expressed similar contrasts throughout his life—living fully as a human, but with a growing perception of his divine nature. The only way to know more than that, however, would be to locate Mary and Joseph in the halls of heaven and hear it directly from them!


