Mission of the Faith Intern Program

Faith's mission statement is "Building FAITH: Follow, Announce, Invite, Teach and Help" with the goal of building up people's faith in Jesus through our church's ministry and outreach. Part of that goal is accomplished through an internship program giving the intern the space and grace to learn from an experienced mentor in a vital congregation. With a focus on biblical truth, the intern is invited to growing spiritually, mentally and professionally through this internship program.

Focuses of Internship

Internship areas of focus include Children's Ministry and Youth Ministry.

Internships will include a variety of experiences that are comfortable and some that are challenging for the intern. There will be one (or a few) primary focuses and a primary mentor for each intern. Interns will spend a significant amount of time and energy in their focused area but will also be involved in several others across Faith's ministries. Everyone is a servant at Faith. The pastors move tables and take out the trash if needed and some staff teach and preach if needed. Ministry is service, and there will be plenty of opportunities to serve while on this internship. That said, the main purpose of having interns is not to do our less glamorous jobs. We are wanting to replicate ourselves -- to multiply.

We would also love to talk with you more about the possibilities of designing an experience that could fulfill requirements for internships in the following areas: publications, graphic design, finance, administration, marketing, musical, and pastoral.

Ideal candidates for the Faith Intern Program

Faith is open to hosting up to three interns each summer. We are looking for candidates who are either discerning a vocation in the church or are pursuing a gap year of service and learning. Some interns may have finished college and some may be in college. We ask that interns are two years post-high school when applying. The ideal candidate is necessarily a growing disciple, engaged with God's Word and daily, open to the ministry of the Holy Spirit, and respectful. The following would be helpful character traits: curiosity, humor, open to growth, and willing to work hard. The candidate is excited to jump into a new community and learn from a new ministry setting.

Particulars

Interns should expect to work, on average, 30 hours a week.

One goal of this internship is to experience a ministry schedule and church life schedule.

You should expect to participate fully as an intern, and also actively engage in our congregational community. Some of your time spent participating in Faith's events and community opportunities will not count as "work" hours, but will be important opportunities to grow in your Christian discipleship, such as participating in worship.

Expect to meet with your primary mentor at least twice a week: intern briefing and intern debriefing. There may be more shadowing of your mentor especially at the beginning of the internship.

During the first week, interns will meet to go through expectations and development of what the community culture will look like.

Provisions

We will provide space and grace for you to be equipped and to be mentored by an experienced mentor.

We will provide local housing if you do not have a home to stay for the summer.

We understand that you may need to get another part-time job to cover expenses. We will work with you on daily scheduling, but our expectation is that the internship is the priority.

The intern stipend for a full summer internship is \$2,250.

Internship Timeline

Internships at Faith are designed to be a summer long experience. Interns for summer 2022 can look forward to the following dates.

Spring

Friday, April 1 - Applications due for 2022 internships

Friday, April 15 - Faith sends official internship invitations to applications

Friday, April 22 - Future interns commit to their upcoming internship

Summer

Monday, June 6 - Move-in Day (if coming from out of town)

Wednesday, June 8 - Orientation

Sunday, August 14 - Last day of summer internships

On the day of orientation, interns will receive important dates that pertain to their primary ministry area.

What will I do during my Faith internship?

Here are some ideas of what your schedule might include as an intern at Faith.

Basic

- Lutheran theology book study with interns, mentors, and Pastor Dave Wollan
- Meeting with primary mentor at the beginning of the week and end of the week
- Personal Bible study time
- Personal prayer time
- Attend a Children, Youth and Family Ministry Team Meeting
- Communication, advertising and organizing

Children's Ministry

- Assist with planning, preparing and participating in Vacation Bible School
- Writing and leading a Faith Seeds message (Gospel message for children)
- Writing and leading a God Squad lesson (middle school youth group)
- Assist with planning and preparing Mystery Bus (mini mission trip for middle school students)
- Assist with planning and preparing Fall ministries (primarily Sunday School)

Youth Ministry

- Assist with planning and preparing the Mission Trip
- Writing and leading FLY night (game, small groups, message)
- One on ones with a couple of youth
- Writing and leading a God Squad lesson (middle school youth group)
- Assist with planning and preparing Mystery Bus (mini mission trip for middle school students)
- Planning, preparing and participating in Middle School and High School ministry events
- Assist with planning and preparing Fall ministries (primarily Confirmation and Youth Group)

Faith Internship Program

The mission of the Faith internship program is part of a larger priority of building up people's faith in Jesus. By giving the intern the space and grace to learn from an experienced mentor in a vital congregation and inviting the intern into deeper wholeness and character while honing competencies aimed at kingdom fruitfulness, we desire to invest in people as they invest in our community.

An intern can expect to work approximately 30 hours a week, with the majority of his or her time being in the areas of primary focus. He or she can expect to meet with their primary mentor at least twice a week: intern briefing and intern debriefing. There may be more shadowing of the mentor especially at the beginning of the internship. The intern can expect to enter into prayer and sacramental rhythm at Faith.
