

Last spring, we issued the goal of *Plus 1*, a call for Faith's members to get involved in the ministry of Faith Lutheran in *one* additional way. Unfortunately, in a monument to misplanning, we announced it just shortly before many ministry opportunities stopped meeting for the summer!



Now that fall is at hand and all those ministry opportunities will resume soon, this is the perfect time to return to *Plus 1* and urge the family of Faith to get involved in *one* more way to strengthen your faith, serve others and participate in the life of the church.

The idea of *Plus 1* was originally inspired by concern over lower attendance at worship services. That would be a prime way to take on this challenge. Attending *one* more worship service each month will bring the divine gifts of Word and sacrament into your life more often.

Beyond weekly worship attendance, there are many other opportunities to take on *Plus 1*:

- Invite one person to come with you to a worship service;
- Engage in *one* opportunity in or beyond Sunday services. For example:
  - ♦ **Learn**—Digging Deeper class on Sunday, Crossways or another Bible study, Faith Groups small discussion group
  - ♦ Worship—usher, greeter, lector (read the Bible texts), serve Holy Communion
  - ♦ Education—teach Sunday School, be a confirmation guide, help with 56er's or release time,
  - Serve—serve at funeral lunches or high school ecumenical free lunches, annual rummage sale, help in the church office
  - ♦ Music—Faith Singers vocal choir, Ringers of Faith bell choir, special music
  - Mission—New Hope Mission Society, Common Cup ministries, the Blessing Box
  - ♦ Fellowship—Faith Family Fun, Seniors' Potluck, Faith Lutheran Church Women, special events
- Increase your giving to the church or missions by *one* percent
- One of a hundred other ways that people serve in and through Faith Lutheran Church.

# New Theo Thursday Study: Beginning September 15 at 12 Noon



of Christ and the truth of Christ in the lives and relationships that present themselves to us in the nitty gritty of life.



I hope you have heard by now that Faith Lutheran has purchased a home. It is an older home that needs some TLC, but it is structurally sound. The money for the house came from the *Faith Forward: 150K* for the Next 150 fundraising effort that capped off the church's 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration, plus an amazing gift of \$100,000 that was designated for a purchase like this. No money from the General Fund or the *Upon This Rock*+ capital campaign fund was used.


This kind of purchase by the church may strike some people as the exact opposite of good stewardship. It is a lot of money to plow into another structure so close to the church. It is a great example, however, of the broader meaning of stewardship. We most often use that word in terms of giving money to the church or other worthy causes, but it actually means the careful management of all that we have and are.

In this case, spending money on a house is a wise investment in the future, not only of Faith Lutheran Church, but the Lutheran church across the country. It will be used for the Greenhouse Intern Community, an innovative effort to form young leaders for the church. It will also be used as a center for young adult ministry in our community. (For more information on either of those efforts, ask Pastor Dave and be ready for a fired-up response!) In these ways, our church is striving to be a good steward of the Gospel by grounding the next generation in the faith and practice of the Church.

# Stump the Pastor

Q: In Revelation, Jesus says, "I will come again." What does that mean or what will that be like?

A: In his death and resurrection, Jesus *defeated* sin, death and the devil, but the *struggle* against them is still ongoing. Just as a sports teams keeps playing hard even when it is too far behind to win the game, so Satan cannot defeat God in the end, but keeps doing his worst to undermine God's will to save the world. Paul wrote in I Corinthians 15:24-25, "Then

comes the end, when (Christ) hands over the kingdom to God the Father, after he has destroyed every ruler and every authority and power. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet."

We do not know how long that will take, but Jesus warned us not to be deceived by false claims about him or to try to determine an exact date for it. "Then if anyone says to you, 'Look! Here is the Messiah!' or 'There he is!'—do not believe it. For false messiahs and false prophets will appear and produce great signs and omens, to lead astray... But about that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father." (Matthew 24:23-24, 36)

What then will Jesus's return be like? The Bible has several descriptions that do not agree in every detail, but all indicate that no one will miss it. Jesus himself said, "For as the lightning comes form the east and flashes as far as the west, so will be the coming of the Son of Man." (Matthew 24:27) In I Thessalonians 4:16, Paul wrote, "For the Lord himself, with a cry of command, with the archangel's call and with the sound of God's trumpet, will descend from heaven..." Philippians 2:10 declares that "at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." If every creature in the cosmos will bow down before Jesus and confess he is Lord, his coming will be truly spectacular!

Therefore, we do not need to worry about Jesus' return or when it will occur. He clearly promised that he will reappear in glory and when he does there is no possible way that we or anyone else could miss it.



Tragedy and Good News Mixed Together: News from the Front Lines of Witness from President Wagnew Andagre of the North Central Ethiopia Synod (NCES)

The Augustana District through one of its congregations, Living Word, in Moses Lake, WA., supports a major training program for pastors and evangelists of the NCES. President Wagnew leads this effort and recently has shared both experiences of tragedy and wonderful news of the Good News of Jesus Christ breaking through in heartwarming ways.

Tragedy has struck in a horrific expression of hatred. The NCES with its congregations is in the Amharic region of the country, the largest tribal area in the country. Due to drought some 30 years ago, a large number of people from Amhara fled to the other

predominant tribal area, Oromo. In recent months, about 700 of these Amharic people were attacked by a renegade group from Oromo and massacred. Hatred too often runs deep and strikes out in evil ways.

More recently, one of the trainees of Pres. Wagnew planted a congregation in a very troubled area. It was going well, but he was stoned for his efforts three

times, the last one leaving him near death. Some of our brothers and sisters bearing witness to the good news of Jesus Christ that receive our support pay life ending choices for their proclamation of the Good News.

On a more uplifting note, President Wagnew reported that 30 Muslims were recently baptized. Four of them came from a 99% Muslim area, which has been very hostile to Christian witness.

Great darkness at times is overcome by the Light of Christ shining in the darkness; that Light we have come to believe will not be overwhelmed by the darkness, demonic powers. Thanks be to God.

- Fifth Thursday (when applicable) Service or activity night







# Fall Men's Retreat (Women's too) September 23-25

## **CYF Parent Huddle: Back to School!**

I have an image in my head of driving through Chattanooga, Tennessee. If you have ever driven through Atlanta, Georgia, you are likely familiar with the twisty roads in Chattanooga. I couldn't believe how fast people were driving and how quickly they were taking the turns. I tend to be more of a cautious driver because hilly mountains stress me out and quick turns scare me. If there has been anything these last few years has taught us, it is that each year comes with twists and turns. Each school year goes so fast and has its own unique quirks. Maybe your child is starting at a new school building this fall or may be in a class with people he or she doesn't know very well. This year will present new challenges that we cannot predict or foresee. Change and transition are scary, and as you sit as a parent or grandparent, it can become more daunting, because you want your kids to have a good year and you want to protect them from all that could be hard this year. Here are some tangible ideas on how to bend intentionally through the twists and turns this school year may provide.

- 1. When debriefing the day or week, don't settle for "fine." My answer to my mom throughout my schooling when asked how my day went was always "fine." Think about other questions that you could ask instead that may require a more elaborate response such as "Tell me about your day" or "What is something that you learned?"
- 2. Create routines that allow flexibility but also structure. The past few years have taught us how to roll with the punches more often that we would care to do. I encourage you to establish school routines that allow kids to be kids, but also shape them uniquely!
- 3. Pray before school! Whether that be together or just you as the parent or grandparent, take the time to do that. School is hard you are entrusting your kids to someone else! BUT, God is with them wherever they go. God says to Joshua "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous! Do not be dismayed or discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you (and your child) wherever you go!" (Joshua 1:9). Kids may resist praying with you; that is okay. But know that regardless of whether or not they pray with you, that your prayers are with them!
- 4. Get them plugged into any of the FLC ministries. You are not meant to walk this walk alone and we would be happy to be a sense of normal for your children! Between Sunday worship, Sunday School, Confirmation, 56er's, or FLY Night we have weekly opportunities for all ages!

We know that each school year places new pressures and challenges on you as the parent. Our hope and prayer for your family is that God blesses you in your endeavors and helps you in the hardship. Blessings to you on your school year!
