

October is a month known for many things.

First and foremost: it's my birthday month! Then there are the beautiful colors and the cooler temperatures. For families of school-aged children, October offers an opportunity for a little fall mini-vacation over MEA break. Then, of course, the month ends with a bang: with Confirmation and Reformation Sunday.

But over all of those, October is probably best defined by Halloween. Fun fact: Halloween- which many Christians chalk up as an evil holiday- actually originated as a Christian holiday, or holy day. All Hallows' Eve, the night before November 1, All Saints' Day, was a day to remember the dead. This was the day Luther chose to nail his 95 Theses to the door of the Wittenberg church, which sparked the Reformation.

But these days, it seems that the holiness of Halloween has been mostly forgotten. Churches avoid even referring to the holiday, opting for harvest parties. In place of holy reverence, we have candy, costumes, and fear.

As a result, October is a month highlighted by fear. This is the month that the movie studios release their best horror films. Neighborhoods are decorated with fake cobwebs, zombies, and tombstones. Haunted houses, hayrides, or walks, spring up in the area. The whole month the focus is on fright.

What are you scared of? What frightens you? What causes you the most fear? For most of us, it's not ghosts or goblins or monsters under the bed. Spiders, on the other hand.... Or heights? Or closed-in spaces? Or clowns? Or public speaking? Yikes!

But there are two phobias that I particularly want to address, because I think most people at some point or another fear them: Thanatophobia and Hadephobia.

Thanatophobia is an intense fear of death or the dying process. Hadephobia, also called stygiophobia, is the fear of hell. After all, everybody dies, and many people, at some point or another, fear what happens after death. As a result, both death and hell pose imposing threats to our peace of mind.

If that is you—if you fear one or both of these threats—I've got good news for you. You don't have to be afraid. Death is defeated! Hell is not your home! Death doesn't get to have victory over you; you get to have victory over death! Hell is a place separated from God, but Jesus has prepared a place for you in his Father's house. There is nothing to fear!

Now, if you are like me when I was a kid, when I was scared of all sorts of things like the dark and monsters under the bed and my dad would nightly

I think we have a speaker/lawyer, Benjamin Kaufman, who is truly concerned about issues


we have. Based on a list he sent us, the Steering Committee chose meaningful subjects. One, especially, concerns the differences between Medicare and Medicaid coverage.

**Greetings Friends!** 

Did you know that Ringers of Faith is 40 years old this year? That's right! In 1982, a group of ladies started buying each octave set piece by piece. Many fundraisers and pancake breakfasts later, we are now blessed to have 5 octaves (around 60 total) of hand bells and 3 octaves of chimes! As the years went on, the group grew as well. This year, we have 11 ringers with some long-time veterans and some great enthusiastic new members. Although our tradition of handbell ringing is 40 years old now, it did not start with us. The first recorded use of tuned handbells was found in ancient civilizations in India. However, we did not see the use of handbells in Western culture until 1696 when Robert and William Cor, two brothers from England brought them here. The Cor brothers' handbells were first used by bell tower ringers to practice at home. Soon the sound captivated people and by 1784, the first handbell manufacturer, John Taylor and Co., opened in England. Since then, there have been multiple bell manufacturers that have supplied the world with beautiful instruments. A handbell choir is like no other ensemble. The techniques and sounds are not found in any other group and continue to amaze people to this day. We are truly blessed to have the opportunity to enjoy this beautiful bell music provided by such a marvelous group of musical volunteers here at Faith.

# Stump the Pastor

With Halloween this month, I decided to re-print this question that appeared back in 2013.

Q: We have friends who will not celebrate Halloween. They say it is a celebration of the devil. Is it really that bad?

A: If Halloween is used as an occasion to worship the devil or try to contact the dead, then, yes, it really is that bad. There are some people who use it for that purpose, so some churches teach that Christians should not celebrate Halloween—and we certainly should not *in that way*.

But that is not the true purpose of Halloween. The name originally included an apostrophe, "Hallowe'en," because it is an abbreviation of "All Halloweds' Evening" or the night before All Saints' Day. Halloween occurs on October 31, because All Saints' Day is November 1. Its focus on the "dark side" of reality was originally a preparation to celebrate the next day all those who walked in God's light. To acknowledge that evil is real and works against God's will is not bad for Christians. It is a stiff reminder of why it is so important to cling to Christ for salvation from sin, death and the devil.

At the same time, Halloween today is almost entirely an evening of fun for young children. It has little to do with actual evil, much less any celebration of it. (We should perhaps be more concerned that "trick or treat" is culturally sanctioned extortion—except that no one is denied a treat or actually does any "tricks" anymore.) Even "haunted houses" are all about the thrill of being scared, not honoring the forces of evil.

In the end, a cultural event like Halloween does not pose much threat to Christian faith. If it reminds us of the cosmic battle Christ waged on the cross to save us from condemnation, it might even be helpful!

# Parent Huddle: Children in Worship

Picture yourself in worship.

What do you hear? It might be the organ or worship band playing. Confirmation students jotting down sermon notes. Shuffling sounds of people standing up and down during the order of service. Babies crying or toddlers "whispering" to their parent.

What do you see? It might be people you know and others you don't. Families. Someone sitting alone. Stained glass windows. Pastors. Volunteers. Communion. Offering. Children kneeling on the floor using the chair as their table for activities. Babies in the arms of other congregation members.

As the Children's Director, I love to see children in worship! I love seeing them joyfully run up for Faith Seeds, wave at other children they know, sit with other families in the congregation and I actually love to hear them cry. And I am not alone. Often when I speak with other members of the church about worship, they tell me how much they love to see and hear children in worship.

But as a parent, Sunday mornings might be a battle. Is everyone out of bed? Did everyone eat breakfast? Is everyone dressed? Does anyone need to go to the bathroom again? Are you sure? How much time do we have? Why is Bobby crying? And then it is time for worship.

How do I get my child to participate in worship?

- If they can read, encourage them to sing the songs or even make up actions to them.
- Encourage them to go around and greet people as we pass the peace.
- During Confession and Forgiveness, tell them that everyone is thinking about times when they might have done something wrong. Have them come up with an example from this week. Then say that Jesus forgives them.
- If your child has a Bible, bring it to worship. Show them how to open up to the readings so they can follow along.
- Easy one. Bring them up for Faith Seeds. Children can never be too old to go up.
- Preschool through 1st grade students can go to Sprouts during the Foundation sermon.
- During offering, explain why we give offering and have them put offering in during the Sunday School hour at Faith Rocks.
- During prayers of the church, ask them what they want to pray for.

Is every day going to be perfect? No. Will you have good intensions to do all these things listed above, but then totally forget during worship? Yes! And that's okay! A huge thing you can do is to prioritize coming to church even when it would seem easier to stay home. At church, your child is learning about Jesus and being surround by a church family who will help you raise your child up in the faith.

# When It Comes to The Great Commission, "Why" Comes Before "How" Mission Reflection from Pastor Paul Knudson

"You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses..." (Acts 1:8) "These are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ..." (John 20:31a)

Sometimes we get all tangled up in how me can be more effective in our witness to those not within the Christian family, whether here or in some distant land. It can lead us to paralysis, thinking we are too old or too young or a myriad of other secondary conclusions. We just do not feel confident that we will be our Lord's witnesses in effective ways.

Too often hidden under the surface, however, is a loss of conviction that we have any right to bear such witness as noted in our Lord's call to "go make disciples of all nations." We are possibly even intimidated by others scoffing at our arrogance that seeks to lift up Jesus Christ as Lord of all. We don't worry about the "how," because we may no longer be confident of the "why" of our witness.

Without getting into a theological defense of our witness, I would just note why my spirit is lifted when I hear countless stories of Christians risking life, even giving their lives, bearing witness to Jesus Christ. They have experienced Jesus Christ as Good News, the only Son of his Father and our Father, who has drawn their wayward hearts home to that One who is "full of grace upon grace", who is close to "His Father's HEART." (See John 1:14f)

We may want to ask ourselves why in the world anyone would go into a 99% Muslim land and point others to the Good News of Jesus Christ? Why also would four of those Muslims seek to be baptized, finding Jesus Christ ever so different than Mohammed and His Father ever so different from Allah?

When you have this kind of Good News that has captured your heart, soul, and mind, you cannot keep it to yourself. You will risk everything to bear such witness. You will learn some about the how of it to be sure, but *why* we "go therefore and make disciples of all nations" trumps the *how* every time.
