


Reflections from Pastor Paul



2022 has had its challenges, both here at home and for those extending our witness to Jesus Christ in word and deed in faraway places. You as members of FLC have remained faithful and generous in offerings and in giving food and clothing to meet needs locally. Thank you for making this outreach witness possible.

There are reasons for particular thanksgiving among the partners we support in Ethiopia. They have recently been facing a civil war that has tested the nation, but also those we support. We hope and pray that the strife and threat to life and Christian witness is now over. The president of one of the Augustana District's partners had to flee for his life twice due to death threats. He and the congregations of his synod are relieved that now they can recover and focus on their evangelical outreach.

Similar stories could be told of the challenges facing our partners in India, Madagascar, and Estonia. Financial support that we share gives encouragement to those facing life-and-death issues. On behalf of these partners, thank you for seeing beyond your own needs to meet the needs of brothers and sisters in Christ around the world.

Through Common Cup Ministries people are fed, clothed, and much more. The \$6,500 that Faith budgets is a leadership gift among congregations. Over \$1,500 has been given to Common Cup through our recent Hunger Appeal. We have also assisted a local charity begun by some women of FLC, Wings, to help children in the foster care program. Crisis needs for temporary housing is also happening through another local effort, HOMES.

Much more could be said, but be encouraged that our faithfulness and generosity make huge differences in countless lives. This is cause for joy and thanksgiving.

November Hunger Appeal Totals

Our goal for this year was to raise a minimum of \$5,000. We are thrilled to announce that \$7,800 was given in November. Of that amount, 45% will be shared locally through Common Cup Ministries. International partners will receive 55% of the offerings: 35% will go to the Bishara Center in India through New Hope Mission Society and the last 20% will be sent to the Friends Of Madagascar Mission. Thank you for your generous gifts in support of these missions.


Missions are Alive at Faith!

"Faith Seeks Understanding"

Continuing Learning Opportunities for Adults

The Wonder, Worth, and Workings of Worship

Why is worship essential to who we are? Why is it worth committing time to worship on a weekly basis? What is happening in worship that we may not realize? This class unpacks and explores these questions and more, as Pastor Dave shares some of his Doctor of Ministry research. The



class will begin on January 8 with a special session led by our Worship Director, Austin, and then Pastor Dave will lead the remaining sessions. Join us in the Faith Center.

"Disciples of the Cross"

The word disciple means a follower. Beyond the 12 disciples, it describes all Christians who hear Jesus' call to "pick up your cross and *follow* me." But what does it mean for us to be disciples of Jesus? What characterizes a life of discipleship? Based on a study by Rev. Steve King, this class will explore an understanding of discipleship in light of Lutheran theology. Meeting from January 8 to February 19 in the third-floor conference room.





Q: Matthew 1:18 says "Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together," but v. 19 says, "her husband Joseph," then v. 24 says Joseph "took her as his wife." How could Joseph be Mary's husband if they were only engaged, and if he was already her husband, how could he have married her?

A: The terms Matthew uses in his account of Christmas are confusing, but only because they reflect very different wedding customs than what we have today. In first-century Judaism, a couple moved through three different stages on the way to marriage.

First, they were *engaged*, a promise to marry that was often arranged by their parents. It could be done when the bride and/or groom were still children and could last for years.

The second stage was *betrothal*. A betrothed couple did not yet live together or consummate their marriage, yet the betrothal had the same legal force as a marriage. It could be dissolved only by divorce and only if one partner was unfaithful. That was Joseph's fear when he learned Mary was pregnant and why he "planned to dismiss her quietly."

The third state was *marriage*, when they were officially wedded and began their lives together. It was this third stage that Jesus attended with his disciples at Cana in John 2.

So, in Matthew 1, the word "engaged" in v. 18 should technically read "betrothed." It was the second, legally binding stage of Mary and Joseph's path to marriage. Matthew calls Joseph her husband because their betrothal was as legally binding as a marriage. Still, it was only after God sent an angel to Joseph in a dream that they were actually married, so only then that he "took her as his wife."

Church Nursery Worker

Qualifications

- ♦ Age 18 or older
- ♦ High school diploma, GED or equivalent
- References: Three references by persons who have observed the applicant in similar childcare situations are required.
- Background Check: Background checks will be required for employment with Faith Lutheran Church.

Responsibilities

- ♦ Role: Create and maintain an atmosphere in which constructive play can take place in a safe and inviting environment.
- ♦ Supervisor: This position reports to the Director of Children and Family Ministries.
- ♦ Responsible for providing age appropriate child care to children ages 0-3 years old from 8:45-11:45 a,m. on Sundays.
- ♦ Responsible for helping all children to:
 - a) feel accepted
 - b) learn rules and limits of group interaction
 - c) understand how to share with and care for others
 - d) feel good about themselves and their experience in the nursery
 - e) know that adults will treat them with patience, respect and concern for their welfare.
- Responsible for maintaining control in the nursery in a manner reflecting the philosophy of the church—setting and maintaining reasonable limits for the group welfare in as warm and positive a way as possible.

- ♦ Responsible for interacting with the children in play at all times.
- ♦ Responsible for cleaning toys and organizing supplies.
- ♦ Responsible for arriving at the nursery facility on time as scheduled.
- ♦ Additional hours for special events may be available occasionally.


