Our first three Faith Lutheran interns- Courtney, Joshua, and Trevorhave moved into the Ansgar House and begun their time at FLC! God has been so faithful in making this happen, and so many Faith Lutheran members have contributed towards making this happen. From the major and steady financial gifts that made the Ansgar House possible, to the generous donations of furniture and household items to make the Ansgar House a home, to the countless hours of work people have put into the house- a LOT of time and resources have been put into making the internship program a reality.

#### But now the work really begins!

Over the next couple months, our three interns will get immersive experience in as many aspects of congregational ministry as we can give them. Thanks to a dedicated staff with diverse areas of specialization, we have created "ministry tracks" that our interns will participate in. They'll gain exposure and experience in things like youth ministry, pastoral ministry and pastoral care, children's ministry, worship and music ministry, and even custodial, financial, and church communications. In doing so, they may discover some interests and gifts they had not considered before, while also gaining a deeper understanding and appreciation for what happens in a congregation. When all the tracks are finished, they will identify one or two areas of specialization in which they will focus for the rest of their internship.

We are excited also to offer some other formative opportunities for the interns during their time here. In the beginning of October, they will be traveling down to the LCMC Annual Gathering in St. Louis. Later in October, they will help Kristen lead the first ever Augustana District High School Retreat. In November, they will join me at Mt. Carmel Ministries for a week of teaching for the Awaken Project. Finally, in January, we are hoping to bring them to Trinity Lutheran in San Pedro, CA, to join with its intern community and the community from Canadian Lutheran Bible Institute for a week of instruction. It's going to be a full year!

## **Stewardship Matters**

There is an old story about a pastor who addressed the congregation one Sunday about a pressing financial need. "The good news," he said, "is that we have plenty of money to meet this challenge. The bad news is that it's still in your pockets."

Stewardship A way of living

One key aspect of Christian stewardship is to begin, not with the church budget or the cost of a project, but with the blessings each of us receive from God. Annual budgets and project costs can often seem too big to handle, but we know that God generously provides for His people, so that when believers give according to what they have first received, amazing resources for ministry can be gathered.

As Faith Lutheran pursues the ministry God has entrusted to us, this conviction drives us to keep embracing opportunities that may, at first, seem unattainable. Looking back, however, we see how faithfully God has blessed our church and drawn out steadfast giving—from Faith on Grove to an expanded staff, from Phase I of the building project to the Ansgar House, from annual mission trips to the new Faith Lutheran Internship Program (FLIP), and many, many more. On that record of God's steadfast providence, we lean forward eagerly into the future, confident that the resources we need for ministry are—and will be—already in our pockets!

Q: Does the church have an official position on (a particular public policy)?

A: This question is asked frequently, especially given the many major changes in society and the law in recent years. There are churches and denominations that regularly—and perilously—wade into the realm of public policy, but not Faith Lutheran, the Augustana District and Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ (LCMC, our national church association.)

The reason for that is not because we do not care about public issues, but for theological reasons. Martin Luther talked about God's work in terms of two kingdoms or two different ways of reigning. He identified them as God's right-hand and left-hand kingdoms.

The right-hand kingdom is the Church, where God works directly in Word and sacrament. Here the Gospel is preached, Christ is proclaimed as Lord and the forgiveness of sins is declared. The left-hand kingdom is the world—home, community, society and nation. God also rules here, but works indirectly through other authorities—parents, government, neighbors, organizations and others.

The trouble starts when the two kingdoms cross over and become confused, and that can occur in both directions. If the Church tries to run the world or the world tries to run the Church, it is counterproductive to both. Sadly, history is replete with examples of both errors and it is ever more common in our own day. It works much better when both kingdoms stay in their lane.

The doctrine of the two kingdoms does not mean that Lutheran churches have no convictions about public policy or what will bless the left-hand kingdom the most. Rather, we think about those issues theologically, not politically. What reflects God's will as stated in the Bible? What expresses love for our neighbors and what leads to harm? What gives life and what deals death? How do we live faithfully as God's creatures and when do we succumb instead to the siren song of "you can be like God"? The Church teaches the faith, rather than takes policy positions, in order to equip Christians to exercise their citizenship faithfully.

In that sense, Christians absolutely should bring their faith into their citizenship and weigh how they participate in society in light of Christian truth. But that is a job for individual Christians as they live in the left-hand kingdom, not for congregations and denominations that comprise the right-hand kingdom. (The only exception is if worldly authorities interfere so directly in the Church that its ministry is impaired. Then, the Church must join the apostles in declaring, "We must obey God rather than any human authority." [Acts 5:29])

It is part of our Christian vocation, our callings from God, to exercise our citizenship faithfully and with all the integrity that we can muster. That allows Christians to disagree politically about what policies best reflect God's will for the world, but it also unites them in seeking what is most life-giving for themselves, their neighbors and the world around us in light of the faith.

## Phase II Building Committee (P2BC)

The P2BC is meeting regularly with our architects, Brian Berg and Kevin Zachman, to establish a general design for Phase II of Faith's building project. Once a plan is developed, it will be presented to the congregation to get thoughts and feedback.

From there, the next step will be trying to raise enough money to fund the project. That prospect is both exciting and daunting! Please keep this project in your prayers, watch for when information about it is presented and join in this effort to pursue together God's future for Faith Lutheran Church.

Continuing Learning Opportunities for Adults



#### Habits of the Household (a Digging Deeper especially for parents)



Crossways classes meet for 20 weeks per year for three years.


Year 1—The NEW class will begin on Monday, September 18 at 6:30 p.m. in the Faith Center.

One of our trusted partners in global missions is Dr. Christoph Wassermann, who resides in Germany but leads witness to the Good News of Jesus Christ to Muslims within countless countries around the globe. To hear him relate his stories is so encouraging and challenging for all of us seeking to be faithful witnesses.

One of the partners Christoph works with is All India Masihi Jamat. We at FLC support one of some 95 pastors/evangelists of AIMJ. The Augustana District presently supports three more. To hear the stories of the powerful witness given by not only these pastors but others working with them is amazing.

It is like we are entering into the early Church where one's witness to Jesus Christ as Lord can and does often take one's life. At the very least that witness can alienate you from your wider family. Yet, through these witnesses, countless people are being moved by the Spirit to come to Christ and be baptized. It is cause for much joy.

We often struggle with how we go forward. We need to rejoice more often in how those with whom we are partnering are powerful in their witness. We have multiple partners that exhibit that Spirit-led, daring witness. Thanks be to God for the privilege of standing with those facing life-threatening challenges and yet go boldly forth.

## Audio and Visual Technology at Faith

Sometimes, having to deal with the fast-paced, ever-changing world of technology tempts me into signing off completely and moving to an Amish farm. Good riddance to it all! If you have felt like that before, I understand the situation. Even as a millennial myself, I still fumble with technology now and then. However, this article is not meant to scare you into avoiding technology, but to embrace it with confidence and encourage you into considering how you may plug in (ha ha ha) with the AV tech team at Faith.



It may sound silly, but lighting and sound can enhance worship as much as music and liturgy can. After all, we wouldn't want to worship in the dark or not hear what Pastors Scott and Dave preach about, no matter how many Vikings jokes there might be! In some churches, AV technology is overlooked. In others, there is so much lighting and sound cues that worship becomes more of a concert. For us at Faith, I take the approach of AV technology serving as not just a necessity (needing to hear and see), but also as a worship enhancement. I consider things such as the look and color of projection slides, the level of lighting in the worship spaces, and the balance of sound during communal singing versus special music. Our system seems to run seamlessly and unnoticed in the background, until something goes off! That is where you come in.

As you know, it takes many hands to make worship run smoothly. Nothing is more distracting during worship than the sound system popping and squealing or the TV projections cutting out halfway through a song. So where do you come in? Right now! We have congregation volunteers on our tech team run the equipment so these problems can be avoided at all costs. These volunteers monitor the recording stream, change the lyrics and prayer slides, adjust the volume, and much more! Thanks to them, I can focus on playing organ and guitar and directing ensembles. We need you, the congregation of Faith, to step into these positions however you may feel called.

Thanks to the brains of some tech savvy members, our systems in both the Sanctuary and Foundation space not only run identically but are very user friendly. So, if you are a worship "floater" that enjoys all styles of worship or if you have your favorite one, you can serve on either system with ease! I am looking to add more volunteers to our AV tech team. Perhaps you and a spouse or high school child can operate different systems on the same Sunday. Even just once a month is helpful in filling this need. I know technology can be worrisome, but I am confident that anyone can serve with my direction and a little practice. I encourage you to talk to your fellow members about what it is like for them to run the equipment, prayerfully consider how you might serve on our tech team, and come to me with any questions or concerns.

For those who are currently serving and those who are interested in joining the team, I will set up a couple of AV technology sessions to get acquainted with the equipment as well as give some helpful tips when running the systems. Mention your availability and we will get together soon! Our audio and visual technology at Faith is an important part of Sunday mornings as well as other functions and by serving on this team, you can have a part of what makes worship at Faith meaningful.


## **Nursery** is Available
