

In the first week of October, three of Faith's pastors along with our three "FLIPterns" will be in St. Louis to attend the annual gathering of LCMC. Faith Lutheran has been a member of LCMC since it was founded nearly 25 years ago, but I find that many people here aren't really familiar with it.

LCMC stands for Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ. That title is a little clunky, but it is highly descriptive of this association of churches. LCMC includes nearly 1,000 Lutheran congregations in the U.S., Canada and several other countries that are committed to the mission of proclaiming Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.

LCMC was founded in 2000 by churches that had become disturbed by the decisions and direction of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). Most of the churches that originally joined LCMC withdrew from the ELCA, but Faith Lutheran did not. Our congregation remained a member of both bodies for ten years and Faith was a national leader in efforts to reform the ELCA. Only once it became clear that those efforts would not succeed did Faith withdraw from it and retain membership in LCMC only.

By design, LCMC is "an association of congregations." It is not organized as a typical denomination is, but, despite its large size, maintains a remarkably small national staff and a nearly flat structure. All but a handful of decisions are left to the congregations of LCMC. Because of that, its annual gatherings have famously short business meetings, allowing the gatherings to focus almost entirely on teaching and fellowship instead.

Faith Lutheran continues to play a significant role in LCMC. Pastor Randy Freund, who served here until 2013, currently chairs the Board of Directors. Pastor Dave has preached, spoken and led workshops at several gatherings. Pastor Paul Knudson has been involved with global mission efforts and I serve on its theological advisory team.

Since it was founded, LCMC has grown dramatically in membership and the number of congregations. By membership, it is now the third largest Lutheran church in America. Although its name is still not widely known, a number Continued on page 2

The Nominating Committee begins seeking new elected leaders, the Personnel Committee considers salary and benefit changes, and work begins on the annual report.

This is also when the church council starts to gauge the offerings that will be needed by year's end to cover all of the church's ministry needs. So far this year, General Fund expenses have exceeded giving by about \$63,000. That is not unusual for this time of year and overall giving in 2023 is ahead of last year. Still, as a church, we would do well to cover the General Fund deficit by the end of the year.

Members of Faith will receive third-quarter giving statements about the same time that this newsletter is published. Please look over your giving for the year, consider it in light of how God has blessed you and continue to give generously so that Faith Lutheran can meet its expenses for 2023 and have the resources needed to do the ministry God has entrusted to us here. Q: Where did you get the name of the Ansgar House? What does it mean?

A: The Ansgar House is named for St. Ansgar, a monk who was born in northern Germany around A.D. 800. He is known as the Apostle of the North, because he led several attempts to evangelize Denmark and Sweden. As part of his evangelistic efforts, he also worked to stop a horrific slave trade. In A.D. 854, he was named papal legate, the official representative of the pope, to Scandinavia. Although the Scandinavian countries relapsed into paganism for a time after his death, Ansgar is remembered as the pioneer evangelist who brought the Christian Gospel to those northern countries.

Ansgar seemed like a fitting name for Faith Lutheran's internship house for several reasons.

- It reflects Faith's Danish heritage. Had Ansgar not laid that Christian foundation, Danish immigrants who came to Hutchinson might never have founded Faith Lutheran.
- It is a distinctive name, yet it is simple and easy to pronounce. It seemed to be memorable without sounding too obscure.
- The educational component of Faith Lutheran's Internship Program (FLIP) ties back to St. Ansgar College, which was founded by Danish Lutherans in Hutchinson in the early 20<sup>th</sup> century.
- Most of all, the goals of FLIP are quite similar to those of St. Ansgar's mission. Our intention is to help train Christian leaders to serve as pastors, evangelists and/or lay ministers, bringing the Gospel of Jesus to people who always need to hear that good news.

As we thank God for the courage and bold witness of St. Ansgar, we pray that He will use FLIP, the Ansgar House and the ministry of Faith Lutheran to raise up courageous and bold witnesses for our day.



### Our Faith Responses to Tribal Warfare Far and Near From Pastor Paul Knudson

Multiple interactions in the past weeks have made it evident that our partners in Ethiopia are experiencing long-standing tribal conflicts that too often erupt into bitter strife. That challenges the Christian witness of our partners in mission. It would seem that our brothers and sisters in Christ, like the rest of us, remain saints and sinners, even as we go forward as the baptized.

Two major tribal groups make up much of the land of Ethiopia. Both the Oromo and Amharic people make up much of the Ethiopia Evangelical Church Mekane Yesus the national Lutheran church. Our prayers are needed to inspire local pastors, and regional and national church leaders to be used by our Lord to bring healing and strength to persevere in witness. The peace that is freely given to us through the grace and mercy of our Lord and Savior does not come from within our still sin-filled hearts. Pray for deep and lasting peace that passes all human understanding.

Lest we become self-righteous in these matters, it may be well for us to consider the strife we face within our own beloved country and Christian communities. Could it be that what divides us could also in a real sense be expressions of tribal animosities? It would appear to some of us that our convictions about what power can do to defeat our enemies may be misguided at best and dismaying to our Lord at worst.

We also are called to confession of our sin, prayers for forgiveness, and pleading with Father, Son, and Holy Spirit to forgive, renew, and lead us to work for healing of divisions that, in the end, only our God can bring.



#### Dusting Off Theology—The Sacraments


This series of taped presentations by Dr. Jim Nestingen will continue to meet *in the sanctuary* to view the presentations on Holy Baptism and Holy Communion.

#### Mugs & Muffins


