Rather than our traditional round-robin with our partner congregations, this year we are going to be giving our fabulous Flinterns an opportunity to preach. Courtney, Trevor, and Joshua will team up with me and Pastor Scott in exploring the Passion events through the eyewitnesses who were there. Of course, we will again be blessed by our confirmation students as they assist in leading worship.

So join us! Be there, as we examine how we were there. Come, tremble, learn, and worship, as we journey to the cross together during this most holy time of the year!

Q: Genesis 1 says that God made light on the first day, but the sun wasn't made until the fourth day. How can there be light without any sun?

A: This very perceptive question came from Faith Lutheran's 56ers group that meets at the church on Wednesdays after school. It shows they were reading their Bibles very carefully!

The children are right that it makes no sense scientifically that God could create light on the first day of creation, but not make the sun and moon until

the fourth day. Genesis 1, however, was not written chiefly to be either science or history. The author was far less interested in all the "when" and "how" questions that fascinate modern readers. Rather, it is *testi-mony* to Who created the world and why.

So what testimony does Genesis 1 give by separating the creation of light from the creation of the sun and moon? It is a witness against idolatry. All of Israel's neighbors were polytheists who worshiped the sun and moon as gods. They didn't see them as parts of creation endowed with a job to do, but as the actual creators of light for the day and night. Separating their formation from the creation of light in Genesis 1 was a way to emphasize that God is the creator of all things, including light, and that the sun and moon are not gods, but creatures designed by God to purvey the light to the earth. In fact, the account of the fourth day does not even call the sun and moon by their generic names, but names them only as "the greater light" and "the lesser light." All of that is meant to drain any "divine personality" out of those astronomical tools so that Israel would not worship them or even think of them as gods.

We thank and praise God for everything to come!



Stewardship Matters

We hope you have heard by now the good news that the family of Faith responded with such amazing generosity during last December that total offerings for 2023 not only met, but actually exceeded expenses! The leaders of Faith are so grateful for such commitment to this ministry. **Thank God and thanks to all of you** for your faithful support.



There is a downside, though. Those year-end offerings comprised fully 25% of everything given to the General Fund last year, while Faith's ministry costs are spread out evenly through the year. The church cannot put off a fourth of its expenses to pay in the last week of the year.

So, our plea to the Faith family in 2024 is to strive to spread out all those generous gifts more evenly among the 12 months of the year, so that next December will not require overcoming so large a deficit. One way to do that is to use Simply Giving to give your offerings electronically. That process is much simpler than it used to be. You can explore it on Faith's web site and call the church if you have any questions about it.

Phase II Building Committee (P2BC)

The P2BC and the architects recently presented the Phase II building proposal to Faith's ministry teams and church council. It got an enthusiastic response and we hope it will get the same reaction when it is presented to the whole congregation at the annual meeting. A free will offering will be accepted to help offset the costs.







Meaningful Ways to Observe Lent this Year

What is Lent?

The season of Lent is the six-weeks leading up to Easter. It is considered to be a forty day period, but Sundays are not counted. It begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Maundy Thursday. Lent is meant to be a season of preparation and remembering the love of God that is poured out through Jesus by His death on the cross and resurrection from the grave that brings us eternal life.

Why Observe Lent?

Lent is a time when we set aside forty days to remember Jesus' sacrifice, enter into His sufferings, and prepare our hearts for the celebration of the resurrection similar to when Jesus went into the desert for forty days of fasting and prayer. Jesus deprived himself of food, but gave his attention to something that was even more life-giving than bread, the presence of His Father.

Lent is often seen as a time to give something up, but it is more than that. It is an invitation to go deeper with God, carving out more time to worship, be in prayer, and reading God's Word.

How Do We Observe Lent as a Family?

- Explain what Lent is and why we observe it. Talk about Jesus' sacrifice for us. Share about how God sent Jesus to spend forty days in the wilderness.
- Invite your family to come up with something together to give up. Don't force your children (or spouse) to give something up that will just make them grumpy.
- Lastly, plan together what your family will add to your weekly schedule that brings glory to God
 and prepares your hearts for the resurrection celebration. It could be attending Wednesday
 Lenten worship services, praying together, memorizing Scripture, or reading your Bibles.

When you celebrate Lent as a family, it is important not simply to focus on what you are giving up, but truly focus on giving glory to God.
