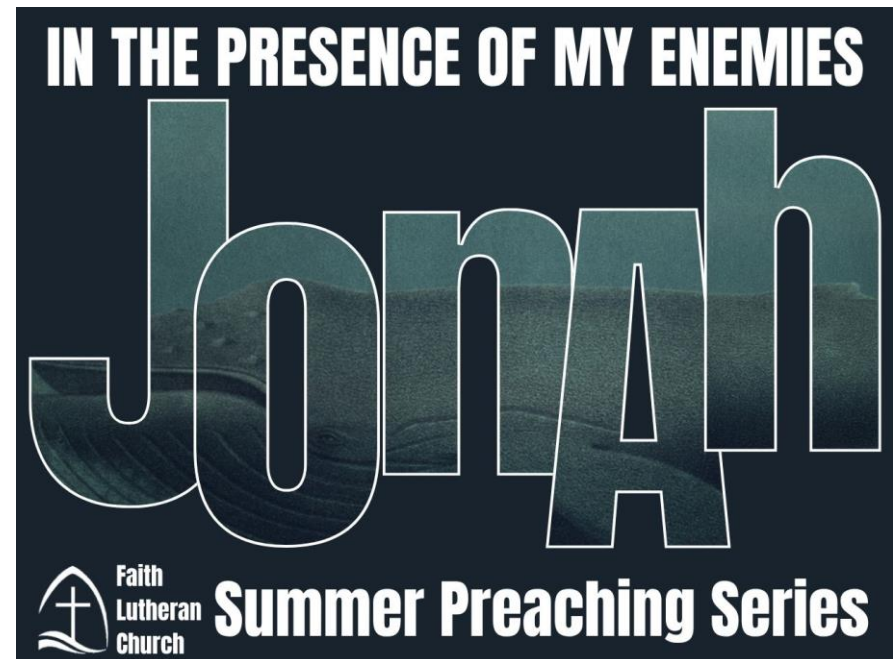
1. Why did Jonah have good reason to avoid God's prophetic call?
