

Scripture Reading: Daniel 2

Nebuchadnezzar dreamed such dreams that his spirit was troubled and sleep left him. So he commanded that the magicians, enchanters, sorcerers, and Chaldeans be summoned to tell him his dreams. When they came before him, he said, "I have had such a dream that my spirit is troubled by the desire to understand it." They said, "O king, live forever! Tell your servants the dream, and we will reveal the interpretation." The king answered, "This is a public decree: if you do not tell me both the dream and its interpretation, you shall be torn limb from limb, and your houses shall be laid in ruins. But if you do tell me the dream and its interpretation, you shall receive from me gifts and rewards and great honor. Therefore tell me the dream and its interpretation." They answered a second time, "Let the king first tell his servants the dream, then we can give its interpretation." He answered, "I know with certainty that you are trying to gain time, because you see I have firmly decreed: if you do not tell me the dream, there is but one verdict for you. You have agreed to speak lying and misleading words to me until things take a turn." The Chaldeans answered the king, "There is no one on earth who can reveal what the king demands! The thing that he is asking is too difficult, and no one can reveal it to the king except the gods, whose dwelling is not with mortals."

The king flew into a violent rage and commanded that all the wise men of Babylon be destroyed. The decree was issued, and the wise men were about to be executed; and they looked for Daniel and his companions, to execute them. Then Daniel asked Arioch, the royal official, "Why is the decree of the king so urgent?" Arioch explained the matter to him. So Daniel went in and requested that the king give him time and he would tell the king the interpretation.

Then the mystery was revealed to Daniel in a vision of the night, and he blessed the God of heaven. He said: "Blessed be the name of God from age to age, for wisdom and power are his. He changes times and seasons; deposes kings and sets up kings; he gives wisdom to the wise and knowledge to those who have understanding. He reveals deep and hidden things; he knows what is in the darkness, and light dwells with him. To you, O God of my ancestors, I give thanks and praise, for you have given me wisdom and power, and have now revealed to me what we asked of you, for you have revealed to us what the king ordered."

Then Arioch quickly brought Daniel before the king and said: "I have found among the exiles from Judah a man who can tell the king the interpretation." The king said to Daniel, "Are you able to tell me the dream that I have seen and its interpretation?" He answered, "No wise men, enchanters, magicians, or diviners can show the mystery that the king is asking, but there is a God in heaven who reveals mysteries, and he has disclosed to you what will happen at the end of days. As for me, this mystery has not been revealed to me because of any wisdom that I have more than any other living being, but so that the interpretation may be known to the king and you may understand the thoughts of your mind.

"You were looking, O king, and lo! there was a great statue. It was huge, its brilliance extraordinary; it was standing before you, and its appearance was frightening.

The head of that statue was of fine gold, its chest and arms of silver, its middle and thighs of bronze, its legs of iron, its feet partly of iron and partly of clay. As you looked on, a stone was cut out, not by human hands, and it struck the statue on its feet of iron and clay and broke them in pieces. Then the iron, the clay, the bronze, the silver, and the gold, were all broken in pieces, so that not a trace of them could be found. But the stone that struck the statue became a great mountain and filled the whole earth.

"This was the dream; now this is its interpretation. You, O king, the king of kings—to whom the God of heaven has given the kingdom, the power, the might, and the glory—you are the head of gold. After you shall arise another kingdom inferior to yours, and yet a third kingdom of bronze, which shall rule over the whole earth. And there shall be a fourth kingdom, strong as iron; just as iron crushes and smashes everything, it shall crush and shatter all these. As you saw the feet and toes partly of potter's clay and partly of iron, it shall be a divided kingdom; it shall be partly strong and partly brittle. As you saw the iron mixed with clay, so will they mix with one another in marriage, but they will not hold together, just as iron does not mix with clay. In the days of those kings the God of heaven will set up a kingdom that shall never be destroyed, nor shall it be left to another people. It shall crush all these kingdoms and bring them to an end, and it shall stand forever; just as you saw that a stone was cut from the mountain not by hands, and that it crushed the iron, the bronze, the clay, the silver, and the gold. The great God has informed the king what shall be hereafter. The dream is certain, and its interpretation trustworthy."

Then King Nebuchadnezzar fell on his face, worshiped Daniel, and commanded that a grain offering and incense be offered to him. The king said to Daniel, "Truly, your God is God of gods and Lord of kings and a revealer of mysteries, for you have been able to reveal this mystery!" Then the king promoted Daniel, gave him many great gifts, and made him ruler over the whole province of Babylon and chief prefect over all the wise men of Babylon.
