

Litany for Reformation Sunday

Martin Luther considered his Small Catechism to be one of his most valuable works and Lutherans through the ages have concurred. It remains an invaluable explanation of the theological heart of Christian faith. Each part of this litany reflects one of the five chief parts of the catechism: the Ten Commandments, Apostles' Creed, The Lord's Prayer and the sacraments of Holy Baptism and Holy Communion.

"What Does It Mean?" Erhalt uns Herr

What does it mean that God's good will, Once thundered down from Sinai's hill, Is uttered now to pierce our hearts, Commandments that our God imparts?

L: The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah.

What does it mean – what doubts relieve – That we may speak what we believe And in confessing witness bear To Father, Savior, Comforter?

L: This is the covenant I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my Law within them, and will write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they shall be my people.

What does it mean that we may pray
To God as "Father" day by day,
Make known our needs, God's grace implore,
And vow allegiance evermore?

L: No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, "Know the Lord," for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the Lord.

What does it mean that water poured Conveys the promise of the Lord, And in the forms of bread and wine We gather in Christ's love to dine?

L: For I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.
(Based on Jeremiah 31:31-34)

What does it mean? God's on our side; By grace we have been justified Through faith in Jesus Christ, our Lord, As taught in God's unbroken Word.

Behold, Lord, an empty vessel that needs to be filled. My Lord, fill it. I am weak in the faith; strengthen me. I am cold in love; warm me and make me fervent, that my love may go out to my neighbor. I do not have a strong and firm faith; at times I doubt and am unable to trust in you. In you I have sealed the treasure of all I have. I am poor; you are rich and came to be merciful to the poor. I am a sinner; you are upright. With me, there is an abundance of sin; in you is the fullness of righteousness. Therefore, I will remain with you, of whom I can receive, but to whom I may not give. Amen.
