Stump the Pastor

Q: Why isn't the visit of the Wise Men included in the Christmas Gospel in Luke 2?

A: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John all tell the same story of Jesus, but each one told that story in his own way. That is why most Bibles title the four accounts "*The* Gospel *according to*" each of the four authors. There is only one Jesus and one Gospel, but told in four different

ways. Readers often want to combine the four accounts into one seamless story, but it is better to let each author's work stand on its own, comparing and contrasting their portraits of Jesus.

One key difference among the four is the sources that were available to each author. Many episodes in Jesus' life appear in all four Biblical accounts, others appear in only two or three (only Matthew and Luke include Jesus' birth), and some appear in only one.

The visit of the wise men or the magi fits in that last category. Only Matthew records their visit and he tells us very little about them; "wise men from the East came to Jerusalem" is all he says. The idea that there were three wise men is based solely on the fact that Matthew names three gifts that they brought: gold, frankincense and myrrh. The actual number of the wise men, however, plus the notions that they were kings, rode camels and exactly where they began their journey have all been filled in by Christian imagination.

So, even though the wise men follow hard on the heels of the shepherds in every Christmas pageant and they all appear together in every nativity scene, only Luke tells us about the shepherds and only Matthew records the visit of the wise men. They each had their own understanding of the events surrounding Jesus' birth and it is helpful to let each account bear its own witness, rather than conflating them.



Leap of Faith Capital Campaign

The Leap of Faith campaign will soon complete its first year and the results so far have been impressive. About \$3 million has been pledged over the three years of the campaign and the account has already received \$700,000. That is a tremendous commitment from the Faith family!

As of now, however, still only about one-third of the households in the congregation have made a commitment to Leap of Faith. If the other two-thirds joined them, the results could allow us to move ahead with part or all of our much-needed Phase II of the building plan. I'll bet some of them depend upon airplane travel, possibly interrupted by the recent government shutdown and weather issues. But it will still be Christmas, because

almost all of the things I've mentioned are not God's message of His Christmas Gift to you. You know His promise of a Savior is being relived and celebrated—the Gift if His Son, Jesus, Who came to us via a manger, Who died on a cross for us, Who rose from a tomb, and ascended into heaven following a promise that He would return at the end of time to receive us into His glory in heaven. The carols we sing, the sermons we hear and more, all put the genuine Christmas message front and center for us.

I recall that when our children were babies and our family opened Christmas presents by the Christmas tree they were more interested in the gala wrapping paper and bows than they were in the presents inside. Of course they were not old enough to know the difference, but we are. I suspect we can be more interested in today's wrappings as well—the gifts, the parties, the family dinners, the Christmas trees, the lights, decorations, "Jingle Bells" and yard displays than we are about Jesus. When Gary Hoffman was still with us and played the role of Santa Claus, he told me how he often made it plain to kids that Santa was not the real Christmas; Jesus is. He was proud of that witness, and well he should have been.

Here's one way Jesus said it, "My sheep hear my voice. I know them and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish." I GIVE them (you and me) eternal life. That's the true Christmas gift—Jesus Himself, Who lives in us, carrying the gift of eternal life for us who cannot make our own way there. That gift cost him his life. Let us cherish this timeless Christmas gift with our whole life, in all seasons, and let it determine the shape and purpose of our every day.

Our Creedal Confession is Crucial to Our Witness

Mission Word from Pastor Paul Knudson

Far from being audacious and embarrassing, our deliberate confession of faith using words from the Apostles' Creed or Nicene Creed moves us to unapologetic witness to our faith in the Triune God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. These formal confessions have moved countless Christians throughout history to face death itself rather than go silent. With the Apostle Paul we declare that we are not ashamed of the Gospel (Jesus Christ), for He is the power of God for all people in every land.

As we sing those beautiful, ever-so-familiar carols, pay particular attention to the words. In these lyrics we confess who this Jesus is. In one of them we sing: "Joy to the world, the Lord is come! Let earth receive its King...He rules the world with truth and grace..." Indeed, this Lord and King is unlike our earthly leaders of nations. For us and all God's beloved children we have Jesus, God's beloved Son, Lord and Savior of all, laid in a manger, dying on a cross, and risen from death to life.

To proclaim this One we partner with other believers in distant lands to bear bold witness. We know that our partners rejoice that we stand with them and encourage them, as they inspire us with their witness. This witness is bringing millions of unbelievers to be at one with their God and our God. Praise be to the Father, the Son, and Holy Spirit.



Worship Snapshot: And Every Stone Shall Cry!

December is filed with songs and hymns that proclaim the good news, Christ is born! Even the secular music we hear in the grocery store rings with words of mirth and glad tidings. This is, in fact, "the most wonderful time of the year!" This month's worship snapshot will focus us on another theme that is not as merry. Ponder these words from A Stable Lamp Is Lighted:

Yet he shall be forsaken and yielded up to die; The sky shall groan and darken, and every stone shall cry. And every stone shall cry for stony hearts of men: God's blood upon the spearhead, God's love refused again.

So much for a "holly, jolly Christmas"! This text hardly feels like it belongs to a Christmas hymn, yet if you open your green hymnal to hymn number 74, you'll find this stanza in the Christmas section. On a personal note, I absolutely love this hymn! We hardly, if ever, sing it in worship, partly due to the interesting melody, but also because this text feels so out of place from the rest of our Christmas hymns. Still, this hymn remains a favorite of mine for that very reason. It reminds me that Christmas is just the beginning of what is yet to be a story that ultimately ends in death. "For stony hearts of men God's love refused again." This story ends in sin, my sin, your sin, the sin of the world. Jesus echoes the prophet Habakkuk's warning with an unsettling image in Luke 19:39-40, "Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, 'Teacher, order your disciples to stop.' He answered, 'I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out." We are all guilty of distraction with gifts, decorating, preparations, and whatever else this world tells us is more important. Let's not forget what Christ has come to do this Christmas season; he has come to save us. As Christians on this side of the resurrection, we know that this story really ends in salvation and triumph; sin and death are defeated! Though we may not sing this favorite hymn of mine this year again, I am happy to sing out "Joy to the World" and "Good Christian Friends, Rejoice" instead. Remembering that we can celebrate that Christ has come again! He comes to us every year, every day, and every hour to bring us peace, love, and mercy. Though it might be cool to hear a rock star singing and shouting, we should never stop glorifying and praising God for the wonders he does in our lives every day. Peace be with you and Merry Christmas!




