Fall is always my favorite season.

But this fall feels a little different. This fall season feels like the beginning of a new season.

A new season of life.

I write this Pastor's Page a little less than a week after we dropped off our youngest daughter, Lydia, for college. We're empty nesters.

We're entering a new season.

And like most new seasons of life, we enter into our empty nester season with mixed emotions. Even though Lydia was rarely ever at home her senior year, the house already feels like there's a void--something's missing. But also, there's the excitement of new possibilities. Since we started having kids right away, Andrea and I haven't had much time with just the two of us. We're excited to enter into a new season of our relationship.

I wonder: is this a new season for you? Are there some big life-changes? Is there something significant happening in your life?

And I pray: might this be a season of faith for you? That whatever is happening in your life--whether the same-old-same-old or something radically new--it might be an occasion to draw closer to God? To lean into your faith? Might this be a *kairos* time?

There are two words for time in Biblical Greek. *Chronos* is ordinary, everyday time (it's where we get the word chronology). *Kairos* is an appointed time. It is *the* time. It's a specific, ordained moment.

If you are reading this, maybe this is your *kairos* season. It is time. Time to move God up on your priority list. To get to worship more. To take a chance and try out a Bible study--like Digging Deeper, Crossways, or a Faith Group. Maybe it's time to jump into a musical ensemble--like Faith Singers or the Ringers of Faith. It's time to pray. It's time to be still, and know that he is God.

This is the time to do it. Embrace it. Jump in! It'll be the best season of your life!

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Stump The Pastor!



Why does Christianity forbid men from having more than one wife when Biblical figures like Jacob and Elkanah had two or more?

There are two important aspects to this question. The first is that God has always worked in the world the way that it was, without thereby approving of how it was. God used militaristic warrior culture without endorsing war. The Bible admits to the reality of slavery without approving of servitude.

Likewise, in the ancient Middle East, polygamy was commonly practiced, and still is in some places. So it is not surprising that some men in the Old Testament had more than one wife or wives and concubines. That reality is only acknowledged, however, not ever approved. Moreover, in nearly every case where it is recorded, polygamy created conflict and unhappiness. Sarah and Hagar, Leah and Rachel, and Hannah and Peninnah all serve as cautionary tales against it.

That points to the other key aspect of the question. Even as God worked with the world the way it was, the Bible often undercuts practices that were not yet prohibited. Amidst a violent warrior culture, God promised to send the Prince of Peace. St. Paul had no power to abolish slavery in the Roman Empire, but his letter to Philemon completely dismantled the foundation of slavery.

Similarly, the reality of polygamy was opposed already in creation by God's intention for marriage. "Therefore a man leaves his father and his mother and clings to his wife (singular!) and they become one flesh." (Gen. 2:24) This witness, together with the unhappiness polygamy left in its wake, eventually led to its banishment among Jews and it never existed at all among Christians. (The requirement in I Tim. 3:2 that a bishop/pastor must be "the husband of one wife" likely refers to divorce and remarriage, not polygamy.)

On issues like these, it is not so much that the Bible is inconsistent as that it tracks changes that God instigated over time to shape people and bring society closer to His will for how we should live. Even so, God continues to work in our world the way it is, not only how it should be, and there is still more than enough sin and suffering to make it clear that our ultimate hope is only in the forgiveness of sin for Jesus' sake.

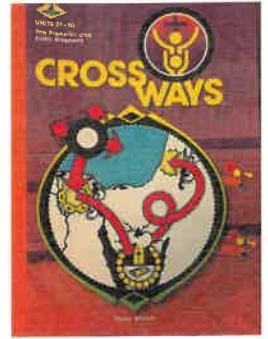


The Organ: History, Mystery & Music

Together, we will dig deeper into the history of the organ in the Church and especially its place in the Lutheran tradition, while discovering what makes the organ a unique and fascinating instrument. This will be an up-close opportunity to hear and experience what our new organ can do. Through demonstrations and discussion, we will discover how its many voices can support congregational singing, accompany choirs and instrumentalists, lead worship, and simply make beautiful music. Whether you are fascinated by the mechanics of the instrument, curious about its history, or simply want to learn more about the new organ in our church, come discover the remarkable instrument that will become part of our worship and ministry for generations to come.

New Crossways Bible Study

Crossways is a broad survey of the entire Bible. It includes an overview of each book, set within the framework of the Bible's "big story." It combines Bible reading, commentary and full-color illustrations to show how the whole Bible fits together. If you want to know your Bible better, *Crossways* is for you! *Crossways* includes a total of 60 sessions, but the classes meet for only 20 weeks each year for three years. They do not meet during December and are generally finished before Easter. You may purchase your own set of the books or borrow a set from the church.

The Year 2 class will resume on Thursday, September 10 at 4:30 p.m.

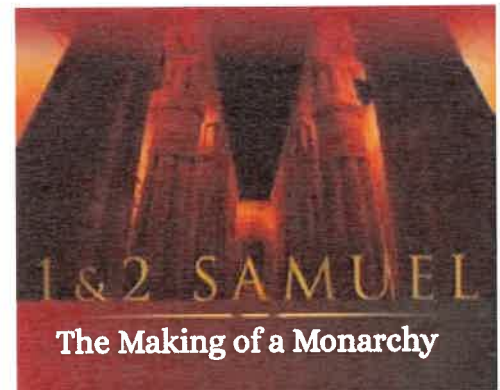
The Year 3 class will resume on Sunday, September 13 at 6:00 p.m.

Two Very Different Challenges We Face in Witness to Jesus Christ

When we think of challenges to our witness to Jesus Christ as the Lord and Savior of all, we may well have our hearts moved by the ongoing challenge to that witness in the face of overt persecution. Our mission partners in India whom we seek to encourage in witness through our prayers and financial giving are more often than may be expected facing life and death threats. The Hindu government seems to be stepping up its overt persecution of those bearing witness to Jesus Christ to unbelievers. Stories are coming back to us of the actual taking of lives of brothers and sisters in Christ. This costly witness is a challenge that cries out for daily prayers.

In our call to bear witness to Christ's gracious Lordship of all God's beloved children, it would appear that we face another seemingly very different challenge. More and more, possibly especially in our so-called Christian nation, we are not threatened. We rather face being simply ignored. Today we live in times marked by masses of people near and far going about life without even thinking about attending worship on Sunday morning. Guilt and shame, it would seem, are not high on people's list of what troubles them. Some of us are wrestling with how this very different challenge needs to shape our witness.

I would invite us to have conversations with one another about these very different challenges. It seems to me that we have issues in both settings which may well overwhelm us. Indeed, we are in over our heads in both understanding and the will to persevere in bold witness. All of this cries out to us to be bold in prayer, personally and together. The Spirit of our gracious God will encourage us and keep sending us forth. Thanks be to God!

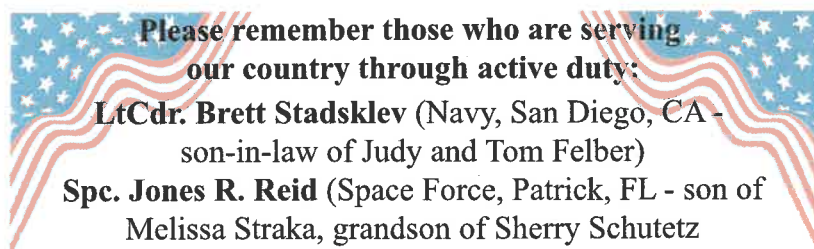
